Rules and Regulations.

slst.—Members who have paid their annual subscription of not less than One Dollar on er before the 1st of September, are entitled to exhibit without any extra charge. Nonmembers will be charged Two Dollars.

2nd.—Non-members will be charged 20 cents admission to the Exhibition; children under ten years, 10 cents. Persons driving on the Grounds in carriages will be charged 50 cents; and for buggies and sulkies, 30 cents, with extra for passengers, if not mambers. No person will be allowed to drive faster than a walk on the Grounds, on pain of exclusion, except by direction of the Judges while on Exhibition. Any person violating these rules will be dealt with as the law directs.

3rd.—Every article or thing for exhibition must be on the grounds, or in its proper place in the Aricultural Hall, before 10 o'clock, a.m., on the first day, and remain till 4:30 p.m., on the second day.

4th.—All stock must be in its proper place on the Grounds by 10 o'clock a.m., on the second day of exhibition, and remain till 4:30 p.m. Thorough-bred stock will not be allowed to exhibit in the class of grades, and owners must produce pedigrees to Judges, if demanded, on the day of Exhibition, or premiums awarded will not be paid.

5th.—All competitors are required to make their entries personally, at the Secretary's Office, Newmarket, or by letter, on or before Saturday, the 1st day of October. Twenty-five cents extra will be charged to all competitors making entries after that date.

6th.—No person or persons will be allowed to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duties, by conversation or otherwise. At 12 o'clock, noon, precisely, each day, the Judges will commence the duties of inspection and decision.

7th.—Members are required to present their tickets of membership when making entries, and also to gate-keepers on entering the Grounds.

8th.—All stock must be the *bona fide* property of the exhibitor; and all implements and articles of manufacture must be exhibited either by the maker, inventor, or their agent authorized to exhibit for them, but such manufacturer or inventor must be a member independent of said agent; and no animal or article shall be entered in two classes.

9th.—Grain and seeds must be the growth of the present year, and all produce must be grown by the exhibitor; clover seed may be the growth of the previous year.

10.—No article or animal entered for competition shall necessarily entitle its owner to a premium unless deemed worthy of a prize by the Judges, and so awarded ; neither shall two separate prizes be awarded any animal or article.—Two or more entries will be allowed in Dairy Produce and Roots, but only one prize will be awarded to each competitor in each class. 11th. -Suitable pens will be provided for sheep and swine free of charge.

12.—Stables will be provided on the grounds for entire horses and bulls, for which a charge of 50 cts. per day will be made—hay extra, which will be provided on the grounds.

13th.—Bulls must be properly secured by a ring in the nose, or otherwise, to prevent accident, or they will not be allowed on the grounds.

14th—No person will be allowed to act as Judge in the class in which he is an exhibitor, manufacturer, or agent of such, or in any way interested in the animal or article exhibited.

15—All competitors will be required to comply with the reasonable demands of the Directors in charge of the respective departments, on pain of forfeiture of prize exclusion.

AF The Board of Directors will meet at the Royal Hotel, Newmarket, on the 21st day of October, at 2 o'clock p.m., when all appeal cases will be decided. All appeals, however, must be made to the Secretary in writing within ten days after the show. Premiums will not be payable till after this meeting.




