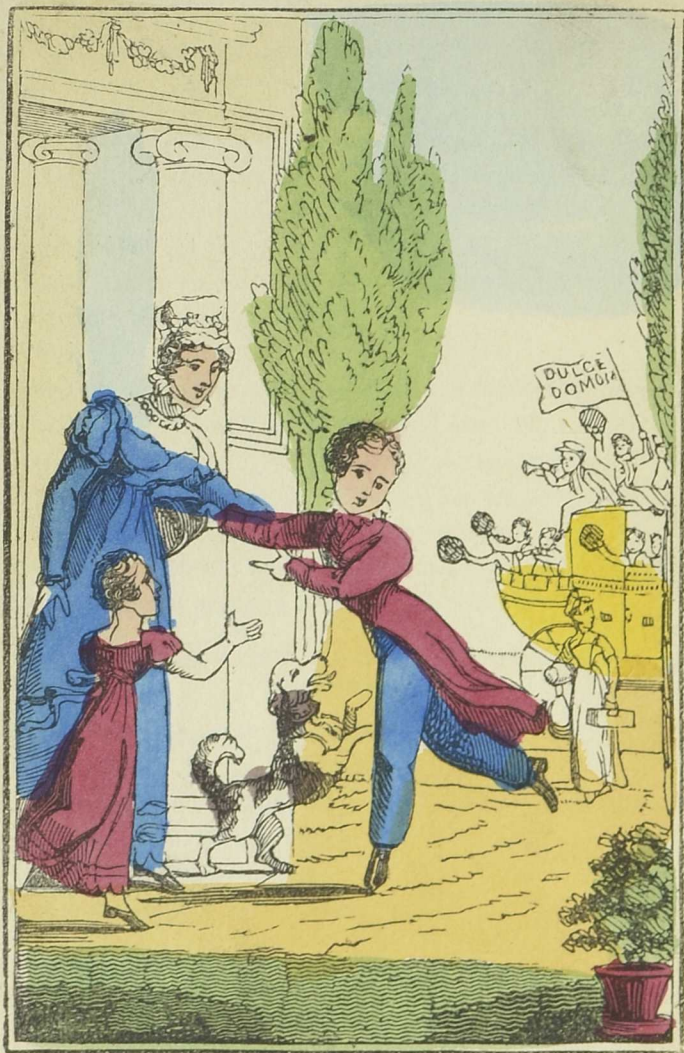

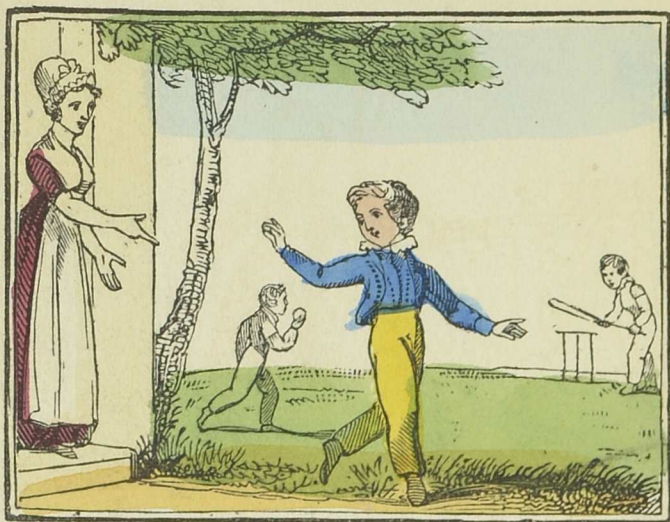

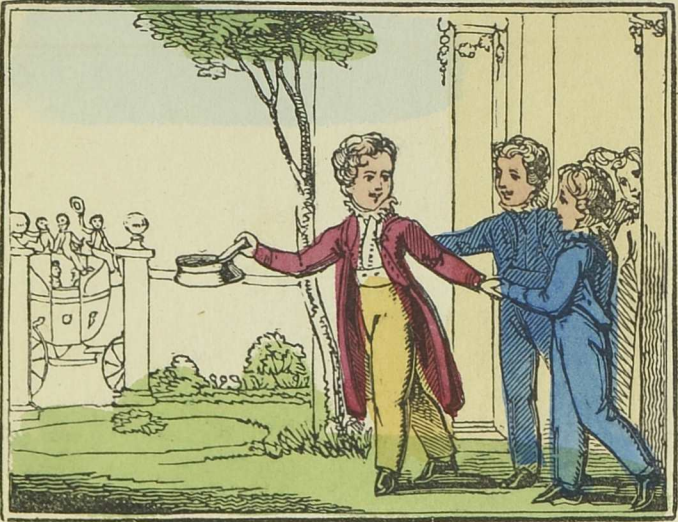

His parents and SWEET HOME.



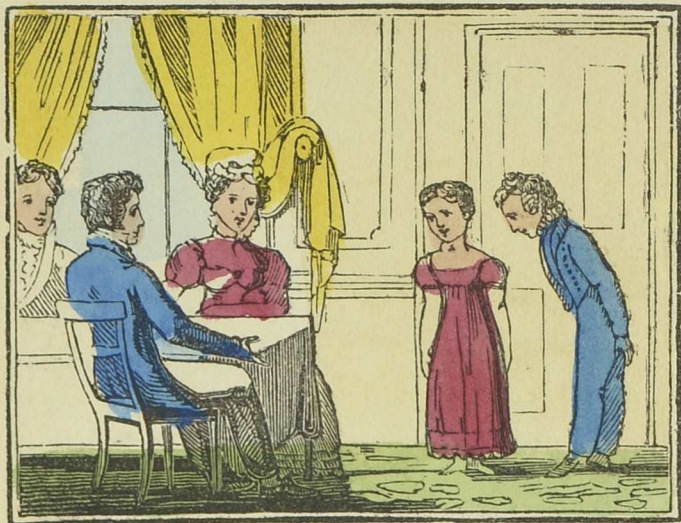
TAKING LEAVE.

And in the garden play.



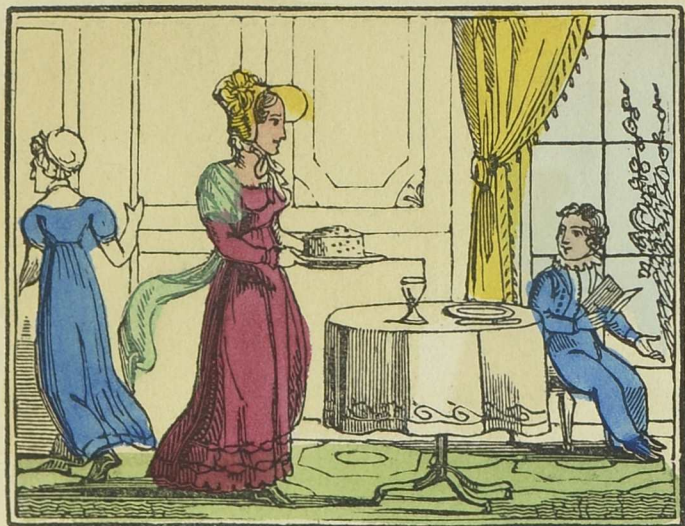
RIDING THE PONEY.

 Is seen again to start.



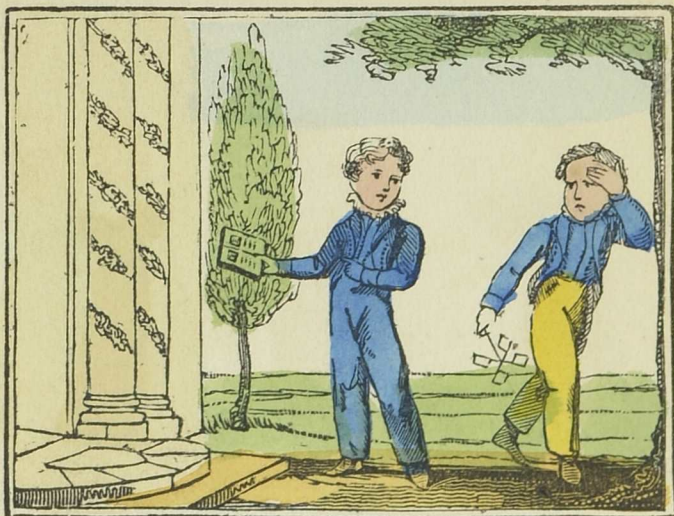
THE PARTNER

green,

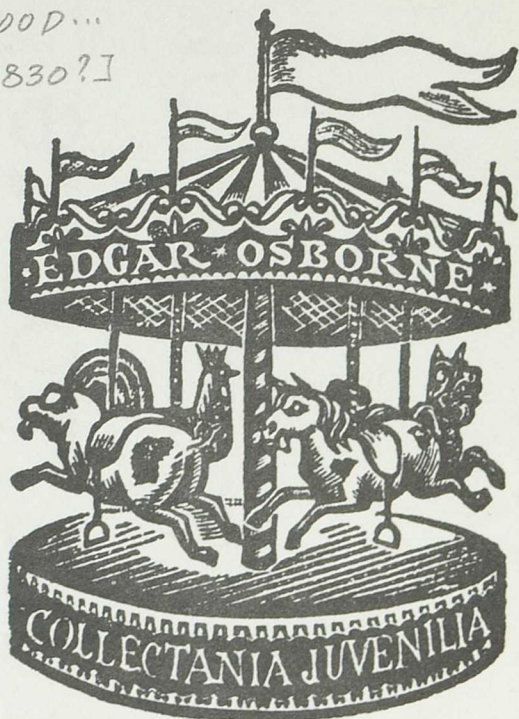
Shall greet him at SWEET HOME.
