



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
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




Fitte the First.




A CAPTIVE in the Giant's hold—

And, coiling scaly fold in fold,


The Dragon watched from day to day.

Or who can burst the Dragon's fold?




The walls had rung with clash and shout;

And still the Dragon watching lay,


From morn to night, from night to morn;

And still the Giant held his prey,


Till one should sound the Fairy Horn.

That, like a fountain, round him poured:


"Way for the Fairy Prince!" he cried,


And gave a flourish with his sword.

The Dragon grimly lies in wait,






The Fairy Horn! The Fairy Horn!

And love and joy are all his own.





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
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
