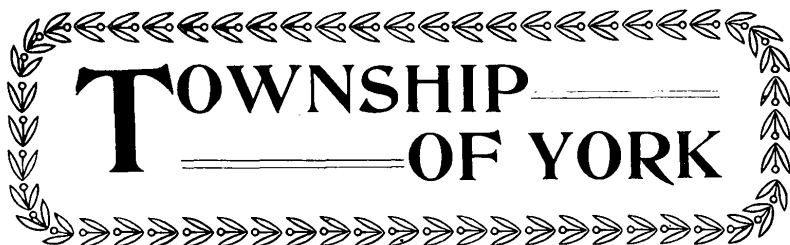
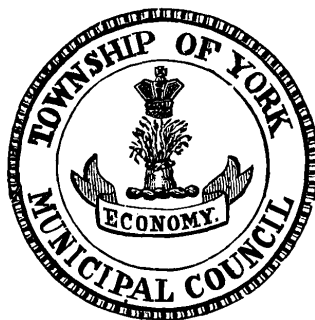

Upon the application of Frederick C. Miller for a recount of the ballots cast in election held on the 7th day of Jan'y 1901, the County Judge appointed Saturday the 12th day of Jan'y 1901, at his chambers, Toronto, at 10 o'clock a.m. for such purpose. Following is the result of the recount:—

In the matter of the recount for the election of Councillors in the Township of York:—

Goulding—Four hundred and ninety-seven—(497)

Maclean—Four hundred and ninety-seven—(497)

Miller—Four hundred and ninety-seven—(497)

Sylvester—Five hundred and sixty-nine—(569)

Syme—Five hundred and forty-five—(545)

Wanless—Three hundred and fifty-nine—(359)

There were no papers wanting signature or initials of deputy returning officers.

There were two ballots rejected for voting for more candidates than entitled to.

There were no papers rejected as having a writing or mark by which the voter could be identified or torn, defaced or otherwise dealt with by the voter so that he can thereby be identified.

There were no papers rejected as unmarked or void for uncertainty. I certify the foregoing as the result of the said recount.

The Clerk, pursuant to Sec. 189, s. s. (8) of "The Municipal Act," upon receipt of the foregoing certificate gave his casting votes for Messrs. Goulding and Miller, former members of the Council, and declared them elected.

Immediately thereafter, upon the application of Mr. Wallace Maclean on the ground that the Deputy Returning Officer at one of the following places when counting the ballots at the close of the poll inadvertently placed two ballots which had been rejected by him in the envelope containing "THE SPOILED BALLOT PAPERS" and not in the envelope containing "THE REJECTED BALLOT PAPERS," where they properly belonged, and on other grounds, the County Judge ordered a further hearing before him on Thursday, the 24th January, 1901, which resulted in Mr. Maclean being declared elected by reason of one of the ballots above referred to, that was marked for him with two crosses (x x), being allowed by the Judge.

It was further adjudged, determined and ordered that Messrs. John Goulding and F. C. Miller were not duly elected by reason of the equality of votes cast for them for the single office of Councillor remaining to be filled upon the determination of the due election of the relator Mr. Wallace Maclean to the office of Councillor, and the Council was ordered, pursuant to "The Municipal Act," to forthwith cause to be held an election of a person in the place and stead of the said John Goulding and F. C. Miller removed from the office of councillors as aforesaid.

Pursuant to the above Order, and Warrant of the Reeve, an election to fill the said vacancy was held on February 15th, 1901, which resulted in the re-election of John Goulding.

MINUTES OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

OF THE

TOWNSHIP OF YORK.

FIRST MEETING.

Town Hall, Jany. 8th, 1900.

The persons elected to fill the respective offices of Reeve and Councillors for the year 1900, namely:—Henry Duncan, Esq., Reeve.

COUNCILLORS:

John Goulding, Esq., Wm. Sylvester, Esq., Geo. Syme, Esq., F. C. Miller, Esq., met at 11 o'clock a.m. The Statutory declarations of qualification and office of each of the members were filled with the Clerk, after which the Reeve took the chair and declared the Council for the year 1900 duly organized and open for business.

COMMUNICATIONS.

Communications were received from:—C. V. Michell asking to be re-appointed Sanitary Inspector. J. Ross Robertson, asking assistance for Sick Children's Hospital. Chas. E. Jackson, member of Canadian Contingent to South Africa, acknowledging receipt of donation from the Township.

ACCOUNTS.

Accounts were received from:—Geo. Bater, supplies for Mrs. Rooke. "Leader & Recorder," printing. W. W. Edwards, services re Municipal Election. Hart & Riddell, supplies for election.

PETITION.

A petition was received from A. McGregor and 17 others asking for the improvement of Bee St. and Cosborne Ave.

RESOLUTIONS.

No. 2127. Miller—Sylvester.—Resolved that the Treasurer be hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the County Treasurer the County rate for the years 1898 and 1899, and the seal of the Corporation be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2128. Miller—Sylvester.—Resolved that the standing committees for the year 1900 shall be as follows: Roads and Bridges, East York, Messrs. Sylvester, Goulding and the Reeve. Roads and Bridges, West York, Messrs. Miller, Syme and the Reeve. Printing and Stationery, Messrs. Goulding, Miller, the Reeve and the Clerk. Legislation, the Reeve and Council. Finance, the Reeve and Council. Water and Light, Messrs. Sylvester, Syme and the Reeve. Carried.

No. 2129. Syme—Goulding.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to accept the taxes charged for the year 1899, against lot 22 to 26, plan 748, less the arrears (\$11.79) charged against lots 25 and 26 for the years 1896 and 1897, and the corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2130. Sylvester—Syme.—Resolved that pursuant to Sec. 72 of "The Public Health Act," Chap. 248, R.S.O. 1897, the consent of this Council is hereby given to F. D. Capps, for the establishment of a grease and tallow rendering factory on his premises

on Greenwood Avenue, lot 9, Con. 1 F.B., subject to said Statute and the rules and regulations of the Local Board of Health of this Municipality. Carried.

No. 2131. Syme—Goulding.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to pay each of the Deputy Returning Officers the sum of \$8.00 for his services and disbursements to poll clerk and constable, re Municipal election, held January 1st, 1900; also, to the owner or occupant of each polling booth the sum of \$4.00, and the seal of the Corporation be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2132. Sylvester—Miller.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and instructed to accept the taxes charged against Assmt. No. 2132, Div. No. 1, 1899, being lots 10 and 11, Plan 528, Binscarth Road, in name of John McKay, tenant, and North of Scotland Mortgage Co., owners, less the sum of \$98.94, charged for arrears 1893 as per statement, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

BY-LAWS.

No. 1799. By Mr. Syme, to grant the sum of \$55.74 for general purposes.

SECOND MEETING.

Town Hall, Jany. 15th, 1900.

Pursuant to adjournment the Council met at 10.30 a.m., members all present.

The principal business of the meeting was the revision of the list of lands in arrears for taxes received from the Treasurer of the County of York. The greater part of the day was spent in dealing with that portion of the list affecting properties in Div. No. 1.

The following resolution was passed :—

No. 2133. Miller—Goulding—Whereas Mr. Earl Bates of the Township of York has been accepted in the second contingent to proceed to South Africa. Be it Resolved, that the Treasurer and Reeve be authorized to issue a cheque for \$30.00 and forward the same to Mr. Earl Bates as a token of the ratepayers appreciation of his patriotism to his Queen and the Empire, and the seal of the Corporation be attached hereto.—Carried.

Council adjourned at 8 p.m. to meet again in committee re arrears of taxes in the Town Hall on Friday the 19th inst. at 10 a.m.

THIRD MEETING.

Town Hall, January 19th, 1900.

Pursuant to adjournment the Council met at 10 a.m. Members present the Reeve and Councillors Sylvester and Miller.

The work of revising the list of lands in arrears of taxes received from the Treasurer of the County of York was resumed and completed.

A letter was received from W. J. Thompson, of Deer Park, informing the Council that Wm. B. Spink, of Deer Park, is also a member of the second contingent for South Africa, and asking that he receive equal recognition with other residents of the Municipality who have volunteered for actual service in defence of the Empire in South Africa.

Syme—Goulding.—Resolved that the Clerk and Treasurer are hereby instructed to meet the Treasurer and Solicitor of Toronto Junction for the purpose of adjusting as far as possible the financial matters in dispute between the Corporations of Toronto Junction and this Municipality re S. Sections 13 and 22, in union with said town. Carried.

No. 2136. Syme—Sylvester.—Resolved that a further extension of time be given the Collector of Rates for the Township of York in which to return his roll for the year 1899, until the 30th day of April, 1900. Carried.

No. 2137. Sylvester—Syme.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to pay Mr. J. A. Macdonald Hazelton, of Todmorden, the sum of \$30.00, as he is about to depart with the second Canadian Contingent for service in South Africa, this

being the amount given to each resident of York Township for like patriotic service, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2138. Syme—Sylvester.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to remit all taxes appearing on his books against lot 17, plan 709, up to the 31st Dec., 1899, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2139. Goulding—Syme.—Resolved that the Reeve and Treasurer of this Corporation be and they are hereby authorized and instructed pursuant to Sec. 5 of Chap. 91, Ontario Statutes 1899, entitled "An Act respecting the Township of York," to borrow from the Imperial Bank of Canada such sums as may be required to meet current expenditure of the Corporation, until such time as the balance due on taxes levied for the year 1899, and the taxes to be levied for 1900 can be collected and applied to redeem such advances; the sum so borrowed not to exceed the total amount of \$60,000.00, which shall be borrowed on open account or otherwise, at such rate of interest on current overdraft as the said Reeve and Treasurer shall consider satisfactory, but not to exceed five per cent. per annum. Be it further resolved, that all advances heretofore made by the said Imperial Bank of Canada to this Corporation are hereby confirmed, and that the seal of the Corporation be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2140. Sylvester—Syme.—Resolved that on account of error in assessment, the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to remit the arrears of taxes (\$1.11) charged against the south seven feet of lot 85, Hamburg Avenue, Plan M, 24; also, to refund to Henry Denby 95 cents paid by him as dog tax through error in roll, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

John Langstaff, re extension of Belt Line Ry. up the 5th Con. of York, Vaughan and King, under the "Ridges" and over the Holland River near Bradford. Chas. Henderson, Solicitor, re David Hunter and Lot 52 Plan 898 sold for arrears of taxes. T. C. L. Armstrong, re Lots 253 to 259 Plan M 6, sold for arrears of taxes. Robt. Kerr, asking for the improvement of Bartlett Ave. The Clerk of North Toronto, re proposed railway through Mount Pleasant Cemetery from the town to connect with the City Ry. Robt. M. No. 2143. Sylvester—Syme.—Resolved that the acceptance by the Treasurer of the sum of \$582.24 in full of local improvement tax for the year 1898, against the property of Taylor Bros., under Assmt. No. 1976, Div. No. 1, for said year be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2144. Sylvester—Syme.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to pay the Deputy Returning Officers for election held March 26th, 1900, the sum of \$8.00 each and the owner or occupant of each polling booth the sum of \$4.00, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

The following By-law was passed: No. 1803. By Mr. Miller, to grant the sum of \$1,047 89 for general purposes.

No. 2146. Sylvester—Goulding.—Resolved that the sum of \$25.00 be and is hereby granted to each of the Public Libraries of Bracondale and Don, and the Treasurer is hereby instructed to pay the same to the respective Treasurers of said Libraries, and the Corporate seal be attached hereto. Carried.

No. 2147. Goulding—Syme.—Resolved that a Committee composed of the Reeve, Mr. Miller, Mr. Sylvester, the Clerk and Treasurer be, and is hereby instructed to report to the Council at its next meeting where suitable offices may be obtained in the City of Toronto for the use of the Council and officials, also, with power to advertise for same if deemed necessary. Carried.

Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue a deed of said lots to the purchasers thereof. Carried.

AUDITORS' REPORT

FOR 1900.

Toronto, April 20th, 1901.

To the Reeve and Councillors of the Township of York :

Gentlemen,—We beg to report that we have audited the books and accounts of your municipality for the year ending 31st December, 1900, and hereby certify that the statements signed by us and attached hereto are correct, and are in accordance with the books.

The income from all sources for the year amounted to \$85,850 96, which includes the sum of \$3,027.41 for percentage added to unpaid taxes as on 1st May, 1900. The total expenditure amounted to \$84,957.93 leaving \$893.03 unexpended, which has been applied on items not actually effecting the year's expenditure, and is shown in the General Revenue Account.

The annual amount due to Sinking Funds has been duly deposited to the credit of these funds in the Imperial Bank special account—however, there is yet the sum of \$6,868.48 due to these funds which has been owing for some years, and we strongly recommend, as on previous occasions, that a special rate be levied to meet this deficiency.

The debentures held by The Imperial Bank for safe keeping, and also by your Treasurer, have been duly examined and found to agree with the books of the municipality. The security furnished by your Treasurer, which consists of a bond issued by The London Guarantee and Accident Co. for \$10,000, and also one from a private individual for \$20,000, were also found to be in force.

We cannot conclude without complimenting your Clerk and Treasurer upon the excellent manner in which their books are kept.
