*To the Chairman and Members of the Committee on Fire
and Light:*

GENTLEMEN,—In accordance with the rules governing the Fire Department, I have the honor to herewith submit the Annual Report of this Department for the year ending December 31st, 1902.

During the year the Department responded to 798 Alarms; this was 143 in excess of the number last year. Quite a number of those alarms were false, sent in by thoughtless boys and others, in consequence of the changes made in the fire alarm boxes, that is, leaving the key in the lock and covering it with glass. The alarms became so frequent that we were obliged to stop making the changes, and in one case had to revert to the old system of leaving the box keys in houses adjacent to the box. The action of the Committee in offering a reward for the conviction of any one sending in a false alarm, has apparently had the desired effect, for after one conviction and the payment of one reward, there were no further false alarms sent in, and we are now proceeding with the improvement on all the other boxes in the City.

The fire losses for the year amounted to \$423,544.73 ; this is very much greater than either of the last two years, but those years were exceptional in the small loss compared with the number of fires and is not fair for comparison. The greater loss of the present year is largely accounted for by four fires, namely, The Menzie, Turner Co.'s factory, The McIntosh Building on George Street, the Horticultural Pavilion, and the Toronto Bisuit and Confectionery Co.

The conditions of those fires when our Department arrived on the scene were such, that with the nature of the buildings and contents it was utterly impossible for our Department to accomplish more than they did, and it was only by energetic and efficient service that the surrounding property was saved in each case.

ACCIDENTS.

In the matter of accidents of a fatal character, this year has been the most disastrous of any in the experience of the Department. One of our members D. J. Nolan received injuries at a small fire on Linden Street, from which he died three months afterwards, and five others, F. G. Russell, W. O. Collard, David See, W. H. Clarke and Adam A. Kerr were instantly killed at the McIntosh fire on George Street, on the morning of July 10th.

The many expressions and tributes of sympathy re-

ceived by the Department not only from Toronto citizens but from Fire Departments and others all over the Dominion is perhaps unparalleled in the history of any Department, and the funeral on the Sunday following to Mount Pleasant Cemetery with the five hearses bearing the remains of our five brave men, preceded by the massed bands of the City playing funeral music, was one of the saddest spectacles ever witnessed by the citizens of Toronto. In connection with this calamity, the sincere and grateful thanks of our Department are due to the Committee of the Board of Trade who inaugurated the Firemen's Permanent Relief Fund, to the Board of Control and City Council for the very generous grant voted in aid of said fund, and to the citizens generally who contributed so liberally, thereby enabling the Committee to carry out the undertaking successfully.

APPARATUS.

During the year a new two-horse hose wagon built by Smith Brothers, was placed in commission at the Lombard Street Fire Hall, taking the place of the old two-wheeled hose cart in that station, and there is now under construction a new and improved Hook and Ladder Truck for Ossington Avenue for which an equipment of Seagrave trussed ladders have been ordered.

The placing of those two pieces of apparatus in commission will materially strengthen the Department.

HORSES.

The horses in the Department (with a few exceptions which it will be necessary to replace during the coming year) are in good condition.

During the year ten considered unfit for service were disposed of, and eleven new horses were purchased; this leaves a total of sixty-five in the Department.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

I have again to impress on the Committee and Council the necessity of erecting a station on Cowan Avenue to contain a Hook and Ladder Truck, and I would recommend that this be a double house as it will be necessary in the near future to place a steam fire engine in this locality.

I would also recommend that a new Hook and Ladder Truck be procured, equipped with the latest improved ladders, for the Portland Street Fire Hall, and that the 85 foot aerial truck at the Lombard Street Hall be equipped with the latest quick hoisting appliance that can be obtained. When you take into consideration that this is the only ladder in the Department which will reach above the fifth story and the many high buildings now in the city, and which are being rapidly increased, the necessity for the improvement is obvious.

Notwithstanding former reports and recommendations regarding the dangerous nature of the network of overhead electric wires in the centre of the City, nothing has been done to mitigate the evil which is each year becoming worse.

WATER MAINS.

There is still a number of the old four inch water mains in No. 6 Ward that should be replaced by larger mains at the earliest possible date.

I desire to convey the thanks of this Department to the officers and men of the Police Force for valuable assistance rendered on all possible occasions. To the press and the general public for the many favorable comments and compliments received by the Department for their work during the year.

My sincere thanks are due to the officers of the Department for the loyal support and able assistance which they have given me during the year, and to both the officers and men for the manner in which they have performed their various duties.

In conclusion I return my sincere thanks to the Chairman and members of the Committee on Fire and Light for the great interest they have displayed in the welfare and success of the Fire Department, and for the many kindnesses and the invariable courteous treatment which I have received at their hands during the year.

Saturday, February 8th, 1902.

J. T. Taggart, of Hose Company No. 8, tripped and fell in station while responding to an alarm of fire, sustaining severe internal injuries. Off duty 30 days.

Tuesday, March 25th.

Thos. Sargent, of Hook and Ladder Co. No. 5, head and shoulder hurt through apparatus colliding with street car. Off duty 49 days.

Tuesday, July 1st.

Frank Milligan, of No. 3 Hook and Ladder Company, hand cut severely. Off duty 26 days.

Thos. Pointon, Foreman Engine Company No. 2, ankle sprained and bruised by falling wall at McIntosh fire. Off duty 38 days.

DENIS J. NOLAN.

Walter O. Collard, Pipeman, Hose Company No. 11, killed by falling wall at the McIntosh fire, July 10th, 1902. He became a member of the Department June 1st, 1891.

FRED. G. RUSSELL.

Fred. G. Russell, Pipeman, Engine Company No. 3, killed by falling wall at the McIntosh fire, July 10th, 1902. He became a member of the Department July 23rd, 1895.

DAVID SEE.

David See, Pipeman, Hose Company No. 5, killed by falling wall at the McIntosh fire, July 10th, 1902. He became a member of the Department November 8th, 1897.

WALTER H. CLARKE.

OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT FIRE ALARM TELEGRAPH,
Toronto, December 31st, 1902.

Mr. John Thompson, Chief of Fire Department :

DEAR SIR,—As is the annual custom, I present a statement of the working and repairs of the Fire Alarm Telegraph for the present year, during which time strict attention has been given to the testing of all alarm boxes and repairs to line-wires, both having been kept in good condition.

Over five hundred alarms passed through the repeater correctly and only once during the year was there an incorrect alarm received, and on that occasion nine of the ten circuits worked perfectly.

On May 9th, the three hose houses at the Island were connected with the Island pumping station by electric bells and kept in operation until November 5th.

During the year all the fire alarm boxes throughout the City were painted, greatly improving their appearance and also protecting them from the weather.

Twelve of the boxes which were damaged by electric light currents previous to the adoption of the automatic cut-out, have been cleaned and lacquered.

After the passing of a resolution by the Committee on Fire and Light to offer a reward of ten dollars to any person or persons giving such information as will lead to the conviction of any person sending in a false alarm of fire, iron plates were cast embodying a copy of the above resolution ; one of each was placed on each alarm box, which has been

productive of much good, as the number of false alarms now received is very materially reduced.

There are now thirty-seven keyless boxes and seventy-one with the keys in the locks, protected by a small iron box with a glass front, and others will probably be changed when it is considered safe to do so.

It would be a wise plan if the Committee on Fire and Light for the year 1903 would make provision to install a fifteen circuit central office switchboard, as the present system is not adapted to the demands likely to be made upon it in the near future.
