## Is The Methodist Church In Port Hope Worth While?

Outsiders may have an opinion and give an answer. But the insiders can become the answer. At the Ecumenical Conference two words are frequently used regarding world-wide Methodism, "history and heritage"; as a local church we have both, we do well to be grateful. But—a church cannot live and move and have a being, sustained by memories however glorious, it must be "act, act, in the living present." I am not critical, only candid; I am not discouraged but most optimistic, but I think among us there is a place that is too orthodox "we used to do so and so," my friends that attitude can soon put a church in its grave; there are some things of the past we cannot afford to lose, we ought not to, they live in the present, but some churches are dying, some are dead, killed by "the past." I call you to the duty of the present hour. It is not what we did but what we are doing, that counts. A trumpet call! forward march!
