When the town is flocking to see a man fondling lions and tigers on account of the wonder of his not being torn to pieces, surely a canary bird that speaks as distinctly as may parrot, magpine, or starling that ever mimicked human interance, is a legitimate object of popular curiosity; and such a marvel is now exhibiting at the Cosmoruma Rooms in Regent Street. The loquacious canary articulates with singular neatness and duency, and with as much case and volubility as he warbles, though his vocabulary is yety limited of course. In the midst of a anatch of a song you hear him ornonnous the words, "Sweet petty little Dicky"—"Pretty Queen"—"Dicky dear," and other fond appellations bestowed upon him by his mistress; he also makes a chirping initiation of a bellinging, and calls "Marv."
