TO HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR.

SIR,—I have the honour to hand in herewith the Annual Report of the Civic Receipts and Expenditures for the year 1879, with the usual Supplementary Statements relative to the City Debt, the Sinking Fund, and other Special Accounts.

The authority given to print the same in sections, as the preparation progressed, has facilitated its completion and presentation in printed form at an earlier date than that of former years.

The same has been duly examined, and is accompanied by the Report of the City Auditor.

In the remarks which accompanied the presentation of the Civic Estimates for 1880, I explained the circumstances, which were known to be beyond my control, under which a small deficit resulted in closing the accounts of 1879.

The reconsolidation of the General City Debt, which has been accomplished since the preparation of the last Annual Report, has tended to the simplification of the several statements having reference thereto, and its analysis as to purpose of issue, given at Page 111; as well as the tables relating to the Sinking Fund Accounts; and further to effect the simplification aimed at, the present Statements of the "General" and "Local Improvement" Debts, and their respective Sinking Funds, are now, and will in future, be given separately, as being Liabilities authorized and controlled by distinctive statutable authority.

Another change, which it is hoped will be deemed an improvement, has been merely to insert in the body of the Report the actual payments made under the head of "Insurance," giving in a separate table at the end a full summary of the entire insurance effected on the property of every Department of the City, including that of the Public Schools, accompanied by a full analysis showing the aggregate of insurance covered by the several Companies holding City risks.

I hope the Report, with its several supplementary Statements, which, year by year, it is the earnest desire and endeavour of this Department to render more full and explanatory, will commend itself to the approval of the Council.
