ECLIPSES IN 1849.

There will be four Eclipses this year; two of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. An Eclipse of the Sun will happen on the 22nd of February, at the time of New Moon, in the evening, invisible. It will be visible in the eastern parts of Asia, in the North Pacific Ocean, and in Russian America. It will be central and annular on the meridian in longitude 153 deg. 9 min. east from Greenwich, and latitude 41 deg. 22 min. north.

II. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on Thursday, March 8th, in the evening, commencing at 6 h. 14 m.; middle, 7h. 44m.; end, 9h. 14 m.; visible wholly or in part, throughout the United States and Mexico, and in the greater part of British America.

Magnitude at the middle of the Eclipse, 8·86 digits on the Moon's southern limb.

III. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun at the time of the New Moon, on the 18th of August, in the morning, invisible. This Eclipse will be visible in most of the Indian Ocean, in the south-eastern part of Africa, in Madagascar, and in the southern parts of Australia. It will be central and total on the meridian in longitude 91 deg. 0 min. east from Greenwich, and latitude 30 deg. 8 min. north.

IV. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 2nd of September, at the time of Full Moon in the morning, invisible. It will therefore be visible in the opposite hemisphere, in latitude 7·90 digits on the Moon's northern limb.

2. The Moon will run highest, this year, about the 7th degree of Cancer, and lowest about the 7th degree of Capricorn.
3. Latitude of Herschel, about 36 min. south this year.
4. Longitude of the Moon's Ascending Node in the middle of this year, 5 signs, 6 degrees, or 156 degrees.
5. Mean obliquity of the Ecliptic in the middle of this year, 23 deg. 27 min. 32·2 sec. True obliquity at the same time, 23 deg. 27 min. 23·2 sec.

The Academical Terms are three—Michaelmas (October 5th to December 2nd, 1848), Hilary (January 7th to March 31st, 1849), and Easter (April 16th to July 20th, 1849); and the Terminal Dues, payable by students in the Faculty of Arts, are 4*l.* currency, including all charges for tuition. The Medical Session extends over Michaelmas and Easter Terms.

Those who are desirous of attending particular courses of lectures, although not members of the University, may be admitted as occasional students, but such attendance will not be regarded as a qualification for a degree.

In October, 1846, the College Council established seventy-two Scholarships: three for each of the districts into which Upper Canada is divided, six for Upper Canada College, and six for the University. They are tenable for three years; and the advantages to be enjoyed during that period are, by the District and U. C. College Scholars, exemption from all dues and fees; and by the University scholars, in addition to the above, the privilege of rooms and commons without charge. The Examination takes place in October.
