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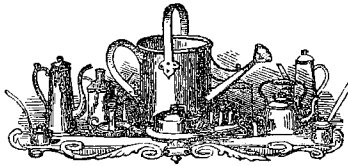
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ESSEX, KENT AND LAMBTON.

These counties, until the year 1850, formed the "Western District," thus described by the Surveyor General in 1796: "Bounded southerly by Lake Erie; easterly by a meridian passing through the extremity of Long Point, and comprehends all the lands north-westerly of these boundaries not included within the bounds of the Hudson Bay Company, or the territory of the United States."

This portion of the Province has been settled for a number of years. As early as 1750 the Township of Sandwich was settled by disbanded soldiers of the French Army. In the year 1792, at the sitting of the first Provincial Parliament, this District was first called the Western.

The English Government appears to have followed the example of the French, and to have settled the country with discharged soldiers, the very worst class of men to form a new settlement. These thriftless and, so far as every knowledge of their position was concerned, ignorant persons were provided with a year's provisions, farming implements, and two hundred acres to each private, three hundred to a corporal, four hundred to a sergeant, one thousand to a subaltern, and two thousand to a captain. These lands seldom remained long in the possession of their original holders, but were parted with for the merest trifle, a pair of boots, a barrel of flour, or a flitch of bacon being deemed an equivalent. In 1817 the population of the District was estimated at 4158; in 1824 it had increased to 6952; in 1832 it amounted to 10627, and in 1861 the population of the three counties was—Essex, 25,211; Kent, 31,183; Lambton, 24,835. Total 81,229.

These Counties contain some of the best land in the Province, and the soil is adapted to the cultivation of all kinds of grain, fruit, &c. Flax, hemp, and tobacco may be extensively grown, and a large proportion of the wet and marshy land is susceptible of being drained, and fitted for agricultural purposes.

The valley of the Thames, together with the rich alluvial flats which extend from it northward to the North Branch of Bear Creek, and southward nearly to the shore of Lake Erie, is remarkable for its great fertility, and the luxuriance of its forest growth. The soil is generally clay, with a covering of rich vegetable mould. The timber is almost entirely deciduous, oak, elm, beech, black ash, white wood, walnut and maple. Towards the mouth of the Thames, and on the borders of Lake St. Clair, is an area of natural prairie of about thirty thousand acres. It lies but little above the surface of the lake, and is in large part overflowed by the spring floods. The soil of this prairie is a deep unctuous mould covered chiefly with grass, with here and there copses of maple, walnut, elm and willow dotting the surface of the plain. The quality of the soil in the various Townships will be noticed in the proper place. Large portions of these Counties are underlaid by oil-producing rock.

A glance at the map will be sufficient to point out the great natural advantages which are afforded to these Counties by their geographical position, and a very slight consideration will shew the extent to which they may be made available for the development of their own resources as well as those of the Province at large. The extension of railway communication, and the making of good roads has added greatly to the importance of this section within the last few years, and it will at present compare favorably, in agricultural wealth and commercial importance, with any other equally extensive portions of the Province.

The fisheries are flourishing and remunerative. Salmon trout, pickerel, white-fish and herring are caught in large numbers. This branch of industry is almost entirely monopolised by French Canadians.

OIL LANDS OF WESTERN CANADA.

Without entering into a lengthened, and to the majority of readers, uninteresting geological, and particularly lithological description of the oil lands of Western Canada, or reviewing the numerous speculations as to the origin of petroleum, we will briefly state that the Corniferous, which is the oil producing formation, underlies in a greater or less degree the Counties of Welland, Haldimand, Norfolk, Brant, Oxford, Perth, Huron, Bruce, Essex, Kent and Lambton, or

more generally, "all that part of the Province lying to the south and west of a curved line, running from the foot of Lake Erie to Stratford, to an undefined point on Lake Huron, west to the mouth of the Saugeen River. A considerable part of this area is, however, overlaid by the shales of the Hamilton formation, and the overlying Portage and Chemung groups; but by far the greater part is overlaid by drift deposits of clays, sands and gravel, and it is in or through these overlying drift deposits, and their underlying Hamilton formation, that mineral petroleum springs are found in the greatest abundance, and wells are sunk through, to, and into the underlying Corniferous formation." The oil bearing districts of Western Canada have been long known to the Indians. In places where the oil was found floating on the surface of the water they obtained it by saturating their blankets with the surface liquid and squeezing out the retained oil, which they used medicinally; at a subsequent period the white settlers used it for such general purposes as lubricating waggon wheels and farming machinery. In many places, as at Enniskillen, and Bothwell, the overflow of oil becoming dried, partly by oxidation and partly by volatilization, left solid beds of tarry bitumen, which are found, from the surface to ten feet beneath it, varying in thickness from a few inches to a couple of feet, some of the deeper of which are separable into thin layers or laminie, and retain the impressions of animal and vegetable life, which had been embedded in it while in a liquid state, thus representing *the characteristics of coal*.

The discovery of Petroleum, on the flats of Black Creek, dates as far back as 1840. In the year 1858 it was tested as a burning oil, and found to possess all the qualities of the finest Pennsylvanian petroleum. As soon as this fact became known numerous speculators, chieeny Americans, were attracted to the oil territory, and all the fluctuations of speculative energy were experienced. The oil was first obtained from surface wells, at a depth of from twenty to forty feet and, brought to the surface by hand pumps; but subsequently a successful attempt was made on the rock, and oil of a superior quality was obtained at depths varying from sixty-five to several hundred feet. The famous "Shaw well" was tapped in 1862. The proprietor, Mr. John Shaw, after months of labor, was rewarded by an unprecedented flow of oil which, filling the surface well, covered the land for acres around. About twenty-eight thousand barrels were secured, but the quantity lost cannot, of course, be ascertained. Soon after

other flowing wells were discovered, and oil became such a drug that in the summer of 1862, it was sold as low as ten cents a barrel; but when the wells became intermittent, or ceased flowing, the price increased in proportion.

The number of wells is constantly increasing, and new *strikes* are being made, and new territory occupied daily. For further information on this subject see other parts of the work.

LAKES AND RIVERS.

LAKE HURON.

This magnificent sheet of water, next to Lake Superior the largest of the great American lakes, is noted for its extensive fisheries and its numerous islands. Including the Georgian Bay, it covers an area of twenty-four thousand square miles. The great Manitoulin, the most important of the islands, is eighty miles in length, with an average breadth of twenty miles. The area is about sixteen hundred square miles. The other islands number several thousands, varying in size from a few square feet to many acres. Lake Simcoe is drained into the Georgian Bay by the River Severn, and Lake Nipissing by the French river. Lake Huron flows into Lake St. Clair by the St. Clair river. Height above the sea, 578 feet; mean depth, 300 feet.

LAKE ST. CLAIR is, in its widest part, about twenty-six miles across, and in length, from the head of the Detroit to the entrance of the St. Clair river, it is about twenty-five miles. There are several islands in the northern part. The principal, belonging to Canada, are Walpole and St. Anne's; the islands west of Walpole belong to the Americans. The Thames, St. Clair and Sydenham rivers flow into Lake St. Clair. Area, 320 square miles. Height above the sea, 570 feet.

LAKE ERIE—The most southerly and the shallowest of the Canadian lakes, in length 231 miles, and in its broadest part about 70. It receives the waters of the upper lakes from the Detroit river, and discharges them by the Niagara. There are several small islands near the western extremity of the lake, the principal being Point Pele Island. Area, 10,000 square miles; height above the sea, 565 feet; mean depth, 200 feet.

RIVER THAMES.

The Thames is one of the principal rivers in Western Canada. The

north or principal branch rises in the "great swamp," in the County of Perth, which is also the source of the Maitland, Saugeen, Bayfield and Grand rivers. At London it is joined by the east branch, which takes its rise in the township of Easthope, and passing through the County of Kent enters Lake St. Clair. It is joined by several streams in its course.

The Thames affords excellent trout fishing at and above Delaware; and during the spring, whitefish, pike, pickerel, maskinonge, and occasionally sturgeon, are taken.

This river is navigable for steamboats and schooners to Louisville, a distance of nearly thirty miles from its mouth, its average depth at this point being 16 feet, and its breadth from 200 to 300 feet.

ST. CLAIR.—This river unites Lakes Huron and St. Clair, and including its windings it is about thirty miles long, and from three-fourths of a mile to a mile and a half wide. The banks of the upper portion are high; those of the lower portion are flat, and in some parts marshy. There are several beautiful farms on the banks, and the villages of Corunna, Froomfield, Mooretown, and the town of Sarnia, are situated on its border.

BEAR CREEK, OR THE RIVER SYDENHAM, is divided into two branches. The east, or principal branch rises in the Township of Lobo, runs through the south-east of Adelaide, the north west of Mosa, enters Zone near its north-east corner, and leaves it near the south-west corner, running nearly due west through Dawn and Sombra. The north branch rises in the Township of Warwick, and runs south-west across Enniskillen to about the centre of Sombra, and turning south reaches the east branch at the "Forks," about nine miles from the River St. Clair, into which it empties through the Chenail Ecarte. Both branches are navigable for large vessels, the east about nine miles, and the north about five miles above the "forks."

DETROIT RIVER receives the waters of the upper lakes and discharges them into Lake Erie. It is about twenty-three miles long, and varies from one to two miles in width. The principal islands are Bois Blanc, Fighting, and Peach Islands. Large quantities of fish are taken in this river, and the abundance of wild ducks which frequent the islands, marshes and parts of the coast make this a favorite resort for sportsmen. The scenery on the banks of the Detroit is very beautiful.

ASSETS, LIABILITIES, ETC.

KENT.

KENT.—This County is bounded north by Lambton; east by Elgin and Lake St. Clair, and south by Lake Erie. It contains eleven municipalities: the Town of Chatham, the Townships of Camden, Chatham, Dover, Harwich, Howard, Orford, Raleigh, Romney, Tilbury East and Zone.

The County of Kent is a fine agricultural district, being composed of a fruitful soil, and when it is cleared up and properly drained, we are of opinion it will be surpassed by few. The major part of the land is composed of an alluvial soil, covered with a thick deposit of decayed vegetable matter, the accumulation of ages. In passing through the County you want no other evidence of the quality of the land, than the abundance of fine large thrifty timber that is met with in all parts. It is heavy land to clear in consequence, but when once fitted for cultivation, it well repays the labor, which is evidenced by the many well-to-do farmers in the County. The principal growths of timber are oak, walnut, white wood or poplar, hickory, water elm, bass wood, white and black ash, beech and maple. Of course large quantities of the more valuable timber have been cut down, but there is still a considerable trade done in sawn lumber, staves and square timber. There is likewise a growing trade with Michigan in cordwood.

The advantages possessed by this County for moving off its products to market are great, as the River Thames passes through the heart of the district, giving an outlet by water to all parts of the world, and as a consequence a large business is done with Detroit and other places adjacent. On the northern side of the County the River Sydenham runs, affording another outlet by water, and on the south lies Lake Erie. In addition to this the Great Western Railway passes across the County, leaving nothing to be desired in the way of communication with the outside world. As there are two telegraph offices in Chatham, intelligence from every part of the world can be obtained as early as in any place not on the seaboard.

The principal farm products of this County are wheat, barley, oats,

corn potatoes, and likewise buckwheat. The product of fruit is increasing. Apples of fine quality are grown here. Peaches are also grown to some extent, and great quantities of the smaller fruits. It is expected that grapes will answer well in this County, as excellent samples are grown; an experiment is now being tried upon a larger scale, which will test the matter. Fine samples of butter are produced. Cheese likewise is receiving the attention of some of the farmers, with every prospect of success, as it is the opinion of parties well able to judge, that a considerable portion of the land is well adapted for dairy purposes. A considerable trade has hitherto been done with the States in cattle and sheep, as the grazing lands of the County are well adapted for raising all kinds of stock.

The climate is milder than the eastern part of Canada, and the north eastern or north western part of the United States; and as the land is gradually cleared up and drained, its salubrity is improved.

The Canada Company at the present date (1866) hold the following lands.

In Camden, 2200 acres, Chatham 1600; Dover 4700; Harwich 2300; Howard 1400; Oxford 1200; Raleigh 4500, Romney 2700; Tillbury East 6400; and in Zone, including Euphemia, 2600. The price of these lands varies from five to twelve dollars per acre.

The following is from the census of 1861. Number of acres taken up 315,252; under cultivation 115,858; under crops 77,039; under pasture 36,277; under gardens and orchards 2,542. Total cash value of farms \$5,585,053. Wood and wild lands 199,394. Population 31,183.

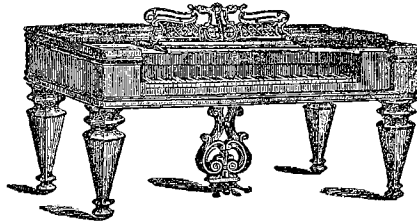

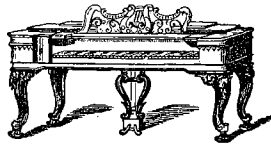

TOWNSHIP OF DOVER, EAST AND WEST.

This Township, (of a triangular form) is bounded west by Lake St. Clair, north-east by the Township of Chatham, and south by the Thames. A large portion of the land, probably one-fourth, consists of open plains or prairies, well adapted for grazing: the remainder is rich and fertile.

In the year 1803 the Earl of Selkirk, with a party of one hundred and eleven souls, commenced a settlement in this Township, which he called "Baldoon;" but the situation was badly chosen, and so unhealthy, that forty-two of the settlers died the first season; and the settlement was nearly destroyed by the Americans during the war. The first settlement of this Township was begun in 1794.

TOWNSHIP OF ORFORD.

Orford is bounded on the north-east by the township of Aldborough; north-west by the river Thames; south-west by Howard; and south-east by lake Erie. The soil is of excellent quality, and the timber consists of the best kinds of hard wood—maple, oak, beech, elm, etc. Large quantities of lumber, staves, &c., are annually manufactured. Tobacco was formerly extensively grown, but, owing to the uncertainty of the crop, its cultivation has diminished.

In the year 1817, there were very few, if any, white settlers in Orford. The Delaware Indians had a settlement called "New Fairfield," since better known as "Moravian Town," in the north of the township. These Indians were a remnant of one of the congregations of the Moravians or United Brethren, who were compelled to migrate from the United States to Canada in the year 1792, and permitted to settle on the La Tranche, since called the Thames. By an Order in Council dated July 10th, 1793, a tract comprising about fifty thousand acres was granted for their use. Their number at this time was about one hundred and seventy, principally Delawares and Iroquois.

By a second Order in Council, dated February 26th, 1795, a survey of this tract was made, and the land was given, in trust, forever to the "Moravian Society," for the sole use of their Indian converts. The first settlement was made on the north side of the Thames. Here the battle of the 5th of October, 1813, was fought, and the village was burnt by the Americans, after which the Indians removed to the opposite side of the river.

In 1836 these Indians were induced by Sir F. B. Head to surrender a large portion of their land, about six square miles, for an annuity of one hundred and fifty pounds. (*See Moravian Town.*)

TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH.

This township is bounded north by the river Thames; west by Tilbury East; north east by Harwich; and south by Lake Erie. The general character of the soil is an exceedingly rich black loam, that portion of it on the front near Lake Erie, consisting of a gravel ridge and quicksand bottom, well adapted, however, for the growth of all kinds of fruit. There is a good deal of prairie land near the Thames, affording excellent grazing. A gravel road runs the length of its eastern boundary.

Two branches of the Thames run through this township. One enters the main stream about three miles below Chatham; the other joins it in Tilbury East, about a mile and a-half below the town-line.

TOWNSHIP OF TILBURY EAST.

This township is bounded north by the Thames: east by Raleigh; west by West Tilbury, and south by Romney. The south-east corner fronts on Lake Erie. There is a fair share of good land in this township. A low, wet prairie, about three miles in breadth, extensively used in grazing, borders on the Thames. Two or three branches of the Thames run through this township.

The first settlers, two or three families from Britain, entered this township in 1833, and were located on lots of one hundred acres each by the Hon. Col. Talbot, but little was done in the way of improvement until about the year 1840, when the opening of the "Middle Road" encouraged the settlers to renewed exertion, since which time the township has gradually improved.

COUNTY OF LAMBTON

This County is bounded on the north and west by Lake Huron and the river St. Clair; east by the counties of Middlesex and Huron, and south by the county of Kent. From the northern point of Bosanquet to Baby's Point, its water boundary is nearly seventy miles.

In the north and east the general character of the land is high and rolling. In the south and west it is rather flat, and abounds in excellent timber.

The settlement of the county commenced about thirty-five years ago, and its improvement has been gradual and progressive. Since the completion of the Great Western and Grand Trunk lines of railway, the former in 1855 and the latter in 1859, this county has made rapid strides in agricultural and commercial importance, and good roads are alone needed to make Lambton one of the best counties in the Province.

The principal productions are wheat, peas, pork, cattle, wool, cordwood, timber and staves. In another part of this work we shall notice the mineral productions, particularly Petroleum.

Lambton comprises the following municipalities: The town of Sarnia, the village of Oil Springs, and the townships of Bosanquet, Brooke, Dawn, Enniskillen, Euphemia, Moore, Plympton, Sarnia, Sombra, and Warwick.

TOWNSHIP OF BOSANQUET.

This township is bounded north-west by Lake Huron; east by the townships of Williams, Stephen and McGillivray, and south by Warwick and Plympton. It is well watered by the river Aux Sables and several minor streams.

The greater part of the land of this township is of excellent quality; in the east it is a loamy clay, and in the west a calcareous soil prevails. As an evidence of its extraordinary fertility we may state that wheat has been raised for fifteen years in succession, along the lake shore, without any deterioration of the land.

Lake Burwell, a sheet of four miles in length by two in breadth, is situated about three miles from Lake Huron, in the triangle formed by the bend of the river Sable.

The settlement of Bosanquet commenced about the year 1833, but its prosperity may be dated from the years 1840-2, when the township was formed into a separate municipality. Since the opening of railway communication this township has steadily improved.

TOWNSHIP OF DAWN.

This township is bounded north by Enniskillen; east by Zone, west by Sombra, and South by Chatham and Camden. Dawn contains a good deal of excellent land, chiefly a sandy loam, some of which is very rich, containing a large proportion of vegetable mould. There is a large quantity of the best land retained by speculators at a distance, and held at prices that retard settlement, notwithstanding which the township is steadily improving. A large quantity of timber and staves are manufactured, and the river Sydenham affords excellent conveniences for shipping along nearly the whole southern boundary.

Euphemia was first settled about the year 1832, and has steadily progressed, despite the disadvantages arising from its distance from markets and the great barrier of bad roads. Of late years, however, the Great Western Railway has obviated these impediments to a great extent, and as a necessary consequence aided materially in the improvement of the township.

TOWNSHIP OF PLYMPTON.

This Township is bounded north by Lake Huron; west by Sarnia; north-east by Bosanquet; east by Warwick, and south by Enniskillen. It has a coast of about ten miles in length on Lake Huron, but is destitute of a harbor. The land is high, rolling, and generally a heavy clay; in parts light and sandy. The shores of the lake are rich in fossil remains.

A great drawback to the prosperity of this, and in fact of a number of the Townships of the district, is the holding of large tracts by absentees and speculators.

Plympton was first settled about thirty-two years ago. Messrs. Crooks, Hill, Jones and Blunden were among the first settlers.

TOWNSHIP OF SARNIA.

This township is bounded north by lake Huron; east by Plympton and Enniskillen; west by the river St. Clair, and south by Moore.

The greater part of the land in this township is of indifferent quality, but in the south and west there are several excellent tracts. It is well watered. The river Aux Perches, which takes its rise in Enniskillen, runs through the township, and passing through lake Waywanosh, enters lake Huron about ten miles above Port Sarnia. Lake Waywanosh was formerly about two thousand acres in extent, with an average depth of six feet, but it was drained about six years ago, and a rich

vegetable soil reclaimed. Lake Chipican, about six acres in extent, is separated by a ridge of high land from lake Huron. A large portion of the best land is set apart as an Indian reserve.

A village in the Township of Harwich, was laid out by Col. Little, in the year 1848. The site is a healthy one, being on a gravelly soil, at an elevation of 117 feet above the level of the lake.

It is situated on the Talbot road, where it meets the gravel road from Chatham to Rondeau; distance from Chatham 12 miles, from Rondeau 5 miles, and from Thamesville 20 miles.

Blenheim contains three churches,—Episcopal, Presbyterian and Wesleyan Methodist; a town hall, three hotels, saw, flouring and carding mills, general stores, carriage factories, &c. An extensive trade in lumbering is carried on here.

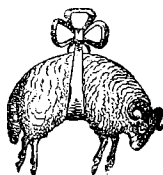

BOTHWELL.

A town in the township of Zone, on the line of the Great Western Railway ; distant from Chatham 26 miles, from London 40 miles, and from Windsor 70 miles. It was laid out in 1855, but its settlement dates from 1858, at which time it contained one store and two saw mills. The Hon. George Brown was the original proprietor of the site, which was disposed of in 1856. The Bothwell Land and Petroleum Company, or "Scotch Company," purchased 5,250 acres lying round and in the town. This purchase gave the first great impetus to oil operations in this section, and is at present in possession of a number of wells. The company is under the management of John Walker, Esq.

Bothwell was incorporated as a town by special act of Parliament in 1865. Population, 3,700.

The town of Bothwell is indebted to its apparently inexhaustible mineral wealth for its prosperity. On the first discovery of oil the lands in the immediate vicinity were eagerly purchased by American and other speculators, at high prices, and derricks and steam engines soon dotted the banks of the Thames. In another part of the work we will notice the "oil fields" of the counties.

The oil refinery of Young, Bro. & Co., commenced operations in June of the present year, and is now producing about 120 barrels, (about 5,000 gallons) of refined oil per week, equal to the finest in Canada for lubricating purposes, and turning out, from the same stock, about 10 bbls. of tar in the same time. The machinery is worked by steam power. Six hands are employed.

The "Old Bothwell refinery," Brake and Hofford proprietors, (formerly Kettlewell and Phelps) was erected about five years ago, on the first discovery of oil. This firm manufactures from 100 to 150 barrels per week, chiefly for the eastern markets.

The manufacture of oil well tubing, tin and coppersmith work, &c., is extensively carried on by W. McMillen. H. G. Beckett & Co.'s machine shop and oil well tools manufactory, is well worthy of notice. Pot and pearl ash are largely manufactured by D. & H. Richards. Besides the above there are several cabinet, carpenter, blacksmith and wagon shops, all doing a good business.

A reference to the subjoined list of names will give a sufficient idea of the mechanical and professional prosperity of the town.

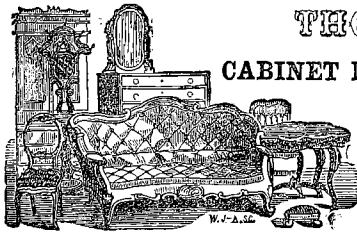

BUXTON.

A post village, situated on lot number 10 in the 12th concession of the township of Raleigh, distant eleven miles from Chatham. The village is situated in the "Elgin Settlement," founded in 1849 by the "Elgin Association for the Improvement of Colored People." This association owes its origin to the philanthropy of the Reverend William King, formerly a slaveholder in the State of Louisiana, who manumitted his own slaves, fifteen in number, brought them to Canada, and formed the nucleus of the settlement which was incorporated by Act of Parliament in 1850, and now numbers 200 families, including 1200 souls. The settlement is nearly six miles long by three miles wide. The land is divided into farms of fifty acres each, and the houses are built after a model, eighteen by twenty-four feet, and twelve feet high, and situated thirty-three feet from the road, enclosed in front with a picket fence. There is a steam saw and grist mill, Mission Church and School, one store, one carpenter and one shoe shop.

Buxton post office was established in 1850, Alex. McLachlin, first postmaster. It contains a Presbyterian, Rev. Mr. King, pastor, a Methodist and Baptist churches.

CHARING CROSS.

A post settlement of the County of Kent, situated on lot 21, concession 4, in the Township of Harwich, $6\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Chatham. This locality was first settled in the year 1828, by William Cook, but the post office was not established until 1861, William Mounteer being appointed first postmaster; Mrs. Jane Gay is the present proprietress. The country around is noted for its excellent producing qualities. There is a Wesleyan Methodist Church within one mile of post office, and two District Schools in the neighborhood, with an average attendance of about thirty-five pupils each. A stage passes here to Morpeth, Chatham, and Maidstone Cross. Mails daily.

CHATHAM.

The County Town of Kent is pleasantly, and in a commercial sense, advantageously situated on the River Thames at the entrance of McGregor's Creek, and about eighteen miles eastward from where the river debouches into Lake St. Clair. The Thames is navigable to Chatham for the largest class of sailing craft, and several of the finest vessels on the inland waters have been built here.

The town was originally laid out by Governor Simcoe, who, on view of the great natural advantages, reserved six hundred acres for a town

plot, but the actual settlement dates from about the year 1832, since which time it has steadily progressed, and now contains about five thousand inhabitants.

Messrs. McCrae, Daniel Forsyth, and Mrs. Larke, were among the first settlers.

In 1855 the area of the town was augmented by the addition of lots one and two, second concession of the Township of Chatham; lot twenty-three, first concession, and lot twenty-four, second concession of Raliegh, and lot twenty-four of Dover east. The principal port of the town is on the south side of the river.

Situated in the midst of a fine agricultural country, and possessing excellent facilities for transportation, Chatham is one of the best markets in Western Canada. Large quantities of farm produce of every description, staves, and square timber, are exported. In 1862 the imports amounted to \$89,419; exports, \$300,640.

Chatham possesses several elegant private residences, and the public buildings are creditable. The Court House and Jail, erected at a cost of \$25,000, is a handsome building, constructed of white limestone from the Anderson quarries. The numerous churches, the Market House, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$6,000; Robert's block, which cost \$8,000; the post office block; the Rankin House, and the numerous mercantile houses, are all handsome and substantial buildings. The Churches of Chatham are numerous and handsome structures, the principal of which are the Episcopal church, Wellington Street, Rev. Dr. Sandys, pastor; Canada Presbyterian Church, situated on Adelaide Street; the Established Church of Scotland, situated on Wellington Street; St. Joseph's, Roman Catholic church, Wellington Street, Rev. F. Dumortier; Wesleyan Methodist, King Street, near William St.; Primitive Methodist, Head Street, north Chatham; Episcopal Methodist; and a number of Colored Baptist and Methodist churches.

Two bridges span the river, one built by Government, and the other by a joint stock company.

Chatham boasts the possession of two newspapers, the "Planet," one of the oldest established periodicals in the west, Rufus Stephenson, editor and proprietor; and the "Banner," J. R. Gemmill, jr., editor. The former is published weekly and tri-weekly; the latter weekly.

The steamer "Heather Bell," Wm. Irwin, master, plies regularly during the season of navigation between Chatham, Windsor and Detroit.

As an indication of the mechanical prosperity of Chatham we mention the following:—Kent Mills, Robert Rowe; the City Mills, Thos. H. Taylor & Co., and the Union Mills, are extensive establishments, manufacturing annually several thousand barrels of flour. The

City Mills includes carding, fulling and woollen works. The Chatham Machine Works, Messrs. Hyslop and Ronald, employs about fifty operatives in the manufacture of reaping and mowing machines, steam engines, mill work and oil machinery. Messrs. Dalgarno, Parkinson & Co., Union Iron Works, are also extensively engaged in the manufacture of steam engines, mill and oil machinery, employing several hands: the machinery is worked by an engine of 25 horse power. The Kent Foundry, John Davis, proprietor, is also a popular establishment.

Mr. John Smith's Tannery was established several years ago. In this establishment all kinds of kip, sole and upper leather are manufactured, turning out about 4,000 hides and 2,000 skins annually, giving employment to several hands. The machinery is worked by a steam engine sixteen horse power. Mr. Smith also conducts an extensive saddle, harness, and machine belting manufacture, including the patent leather fly net for horses.

In addition to the foregoing, there are several other establishments in successful operation. We may mention the Kent Brewery, the Cabinet Factories of Messrs. Jahnke and R. O. Smith, Small & Quirk's Pump and Straw Cutter Factory, and the Carriage Factories of Messrs. Sheriff, and Gemmell and Young. Messrs. J. Northwood & Son and S. Aldis are largely engaged in the manufacture of lumber.

EDUCATIONAL.—Senior County Grammar School.—Pleasantly situated in the north-east corner of the town, in the vicinity of the county buildings. It is a large and commodious brick structure, with a dwelling-house and garden attached. It was erected in the year 1863, at a cost of \$5,800. The school is open to both males and females. The standard of admission is that prescribed by the Council of Public Instruction, Toronto. The course of instruction embraces a thorough Classical, Mathematical and Commercial Education. The fees are per term, for pupils residing in town \$2; all others \$1.

Central School, located on Wellington Street. Number of books in the library, 117.

North Chatham School—Miss Cornelian Pratt, teacher; salary, \$280.

Ursuline Academy—(boarding and day school)—situated on Murray Street, built of brick; cost \$11,200; Madam Xavier, lady-superior.

School for colored children, situated on Princess street.

A village in the township of Harwich, five miles from Blenheim and seventeen from Chatham. It is a harbor on Lake Erie, sixty-five miles below the head of the lake. A projecting cape encloses a basin of about six thousand acres in extent, averaging eleven feet in depth. The harbor was improved by cutting a channel through the bar running across it, which with the piers, &c., cost \$170,000. The road between this place and Chatham is one of the best in the Province. Rondeau contains one steam saw mill, a general store, blacksmith shop, carpenter shop, and one tavern. Population about 230.

**THAMESVILLE OR TECUMSEH.\***

A village and station on the Great Western railway, at the intersection of the London, Chatham, Morpeth and Florence roads, principally situated on lot fifteen, concession B, township of Camden. The site was surveyed in 1856 by David Sherman, Esq. Wm. Mayhew was the first postmaster. It is distant from Chatham 15 miles; London, 50 miles; Morpeth, 12 miles, and from Ridgetown, 9 miles. There are good grounds to believe that a rich vein of petroleum lies in and near the village, and salt and iron ore have been found. The sixth Division Court is held here. Daily mails. Population about 600.

About three miles from Thamesville is the Indian settlement of Moravian town, the site of the "Battle of the Thames," between the British and the Americans, Oct. 5, 1813. We condense the following account of this memorable engagement from the "History of the War of 1812-15."

"The principal result of 'Perry's Victory' was to necessitate the abandonment of all the positions held by the British beyond Lake Erie, and it was the intention of General Proctor to retire on the centre division at Niagara. Unfortunately the mingled reproaches and entreaties of Tecumseh induced him to change his intention and retire on the Moravian village, nearly half way between Amherstburg and the centre division, and there await the pursuing enemy. The following is the closing clause of the chief's speech:—'Father! you have got the arms and ammunition which our great father sent for his red children. If you have any idea of going away give them to us, and you may go in welcome for us. Our lives are in the hands of the Great Spirit. We are determined to defend our lands, and if it is His will we wish to leave our bones upon them.'

"The British were drawn up in line in a wood, not far from the Moravian settlement, with the Indians on the right, and a piece of cannon, a six-pounder on the left. The whole British force actually engaged in the battle numbered four hundred and seventy-six men. The Americans numbered twelve hundred cavalry, nineteen hundred and fifty infantry, and one hundred and fifty Indians.

"Harrison drew up his forces in two lines, and commenced the attack by a simultaneous charge on both the British and Indians. In both cases the first charge was repulsed, but a second decided the fate of the day. The British retreated first, and the Indians retreated on seeing the fate of their allies. The result of an affair against a body of

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\* Tecumseh (or Tecumthé) was a chief of the Shawnee tribe, and brother of the celebrated "Prophet," defeated by Harrison at the battle of Tippecanoe. He was the warm friend and ally of the English; and held the rank of Brigadier in the British army. He opposed the civilization of the Indians, but in a measure adopted the habits of the whites. He was a man of noble appearance, inflexible principle, honorable, and humane. He died at the early age of forty-four years.

such numerical superiority and under the most disadvantageous circumstances, may easily be anticipated. 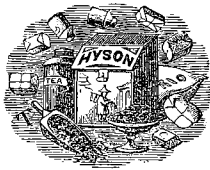

Dickison have an excellent factory for carding, dressing and fulling.

The religious denominations consist of an Episcopal, Roman Catholic, Wesleyan Methodist, Episcopal Methodist, and Baptist Churches. There is one school, with an average attendance of 65, pupils, H. D. Johnson teacher.

Arkona was first settled in 1832 by John Smith, and was first called Bosanquet. There are now few villages in the Province, not on a line of railway or having water communication, that are more prosperous, and in which there is greater business done, the inhabitants being noted for their general industry and enterprise.

**FROOMFIELD.**

(CORUNNA P. O.)

A village on the St. Clair river, five miles south of Sarnia. It was laid out by Froome Talfourd, Esq., in the year 1836, and was for a long time called the Windmill, that being the principal object of attraction at the time. A saw and grist mills were built on the creek, a little south of the village, shortly after the village was laid out; but these have long since disappeared, and now the only business operation carried on in the place is a saw mill, owned by Mr. James Major. There are extensive wood docks at this place, and a large business in this line is annually done with the American steamers. There are also many staves and much timber annually exported. A little south of this village is what is called Stag Island, in the River St. Clair, containing about fifty acres, and affords a splendid retreat for pic-nic parties in the summer. Immediately north of Froomfield is the Indian reserve, which extends to the town of Sarnia.

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### OIL SPRINGS.

This important Village is situated in the Township of Enniskillen, on Black Creek, a tributary of the River Sydenham, distant from Wyoming, a station on the Sarnia branch of the G. W. R., 12 miles, from Petrolia, 7 miles, from Wallaceburgh twenty miles, and from Sarnia about 20 miles, the road to the County Town being planked and in excellent condition for the stages which daily traverse the distance. This road was opened in the year 1863. In the same year telegraphic communication was established, and in 1862, the "Oil Springs Chronicle," a paper devoted to the oil interest, was started by Messrs. Hudson & Solis; this excellent periodical is now under the management of Mr. John Smith. As the name indicates this village owes its rise, progress and prosperity to the Petroleum found in the locality. In another portion of the work reference is made to

the celebrated Shaw Well, which was tapped in January, 1862, which of itself was conducive to the fame of the village. Oil was observed in this locality years before its nature and value were understood, and in 1858, Mr. Williams, since President of the Canada Rock Oil Company, explored the region and found that Petroleum existed in inexhaustible quantities. In 1860, the village was laid out by Mr. J. M. Williams, James Thompson, W. E. Sanborn, and Hugh M. Shaw, since which time it has rapidly increased. The number of Oil wells now sunk is estimated at about 1500, some of which are pumped by steam. Wells, refineries and stills extend along the creeks for miles.

The village contains a number of well stocked stores, the merchants finding a ready market for their goods. There are a number of excellent hotels, the "Sherman," "Anglo American," and "Brantford House," being the most popular. All other branches of industry are ably represented here, and seem to be in a flourishing condition. The Churches are three in number, viz., Episcopal, Rev. Mr. Brookman; Wesleyan Methodist, Rev. Mr. Eastman; and Roman Catholic no resident minister. There is a Re-union Club for Literary and Musical Entertainments—F. A. Rea, President, and R. Matheson, Secretary. The Alexandra Masonic Lodge, No. 158, meets on Thursdays on or after full moon—Thos Ellison, W. M., D. McDonald, Secretary. Mails, Daily. Population, about 3000.

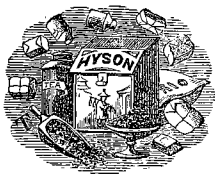

**PETROLIA.**

This rapidly improving village is situated in the township of Enniskillen, on the flats of Bear Creek. Last December it consisted of about a dozen houses, and now contains a population of nearly 2,300.

Petrolia is connected with the Sarnia branch of the Great Western Railway by a railway to Wyoming, distant 5 miles, and from Sarnia 21 miles. This locality was originally settled in 1838 by Samuel Eveland; the post office was established in 1861, Wm. Coutley being appointed first postmaster. The office is now under the management of Patrick Barclay. It is proposed to have Petrolia incorporated as a village this present winter.

The rapid rise of Petrolia, and the unparalleled success of the wells which have been sunk since oil was first discovered here, have prevented, in a great measure, the several improvements requisite in a village of its size; in fact, the early gold seeker to California or to Pike's Peak will be reminded here of his experience in those Pacific-bound localities at the time of their first discovery. Situated in the midst of a woody country, with hill, dale and swamp in abundance, it will be some time before the village of Petrolia will present the appearance of an old established settlement.

The retail business of this village is confined to one street, which presents quite an animated appearance. There are several large and well-stocked stores, and others are being rapidly built. The hotels are numerous and capable of affording all the accommodation usually found in a city.

The number of wells sunk in the locality is beyond computation. Some of them are very successful.

There are already four churches in Petrolia, viz., Roman Catholic, Canada Presbyterian, Wesleyan and Episcopal Methodist churches. Also, one Common School, Donald McDonald, teacher.

A Masonic Lodge holds meetings here on the second Wednesday of each month, H. H. Hunt, W.M.

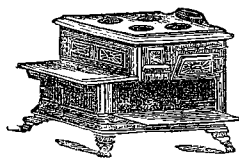

**POINT EDWARD, OR HURON VILLAGE.**

A flourishing village in the township of Sarnia, situated on a point of land running into the river St. Clair, at the entrance to Lake Huron, formerly a military reserve, but purchased by the G. T. R. Co. for station purposes, containing about one thousand acres, and noted for its excellent fisheries. This point is said to have been formerly an island, but the north portion of the channel on the east side was filled up, thus connecting it with the main land, and forming a well sheltered bay. This village is the terminus of the Grand Trunk Railway in Canada, and owes its origin to this circumstance. The Company have erected an extensive depot on this point, station, freight, engine houses, sheds, docks, brick dwelling houses for the employees, and an elevator having a capacity of about 150,000 bushels. A steam ferry connects with Fort Gratiot on the Michigan side, the river being always open here, and a daily line of steamers connects with trains for Montreal, Buffalo and Portland. Stages ply between this point and Oil Springs.

The post office was established in 1865, Louis Ernst first and present P. M. Daily mails. Population about 600.

Grand Trunk line of steamers to Chicago. Propellers "Sun," Capt. R. A. Jones; "Montgomery," Capt. Archibald Gillies; "B. F. Wade," Capt. James Snow. **SARNIA.**

The County Town of Lambton, is situated in the Township of Sarnia, near the junction of the River St. Clair with Lake Huron, and opposite the city of Port Huron in Michigan, with which it has constant communication by steam ferry. It is the terminus of the Grand Trunk, and the Sarnia Branch of the Great Western railways, both companies having extensive depots here. (*See Point Edward.*)

Sarnia was laid out as a town in 1833, by the Hon. M. Cameron, at least that portion of it south of George, and north of Cromwell streets, consisting of one hundred acres. The northern part, two hundred acres, formed the Vidal estate, and was not laid out in town plots for several years after. Mr. Cameron was very assiduous in promoting the interests of the town at its commencement, and it is indebted to his enterprise in no small degree for its present prosperity.

Sarnia was formerly the best place of departure for hundreds of vessels, but since the introduction of steam tugs, very few sailing vessels are obliged to take shelter in the harbor as formerly, for the river from Fort Gratiot, having a current of four miles an hour, is not navigable for sailing crafts except when aided by south, south easterly or westerly winds.

Situated on a healthy site, at an elevation of eighteen feet above the river, possessing excellent facilities for transportation, and one of the best harbors in the Province, the commercial and manufacturing advantages of Sarnia cannot be overrated, and the establishment of good roads through the county will materially advance its prosperity. The public and private buildings are numerous, and of a superior kind. Of the former we may particularly notice the Bank of Upper Canada, town hall and school houses, built of brick, and the court house and gaol, built of stone. The streets are well paved, and regularly laid out, crossing each other at right angles.

Sarnia possesses excellent hotel accommodation. The principal are the "Alexander House," Geo. W. Fay, proprietor; "Belchamber's Hotel," newly erected, one of the largest houses of the kind in the West: this house contains seventy-five rooms, and cost upwards of \$17,000; the "St. Clair," F. W. Baker, also, newly erected; the "Western Hotel," W. G. Harkness, well and favorably known; and the "Farmer's Hotel," W. J. McElheron.

The "Sarnia brewery," Geo. Russell, proprietor, is an extensive establishment. "Adams' mills," steam, 25 horse power, has a capacity of one hundred barrels per diem. The steam saw-mill of Messrs. R & H. Mackenzie has a capacity of one million feet per annum, in addition this firm does a large business in the manufacture of sash, blinds, siding, matched flooring, cabinet making, etc., employing about twenty operatives. Hall & Bros. are extensive tanners and

curriers. The "Lambton foundry and machine shop," N. C. Pater-son, turns out large quantities of oil well tools, agricultural implements, and mill machinery. The manufacture of pot and pearl ash, soap, &c., is largely carried on by Thos. Whiffen. The mercantile, manu-facturing and mechanical prosperity of the town may be judged by reference to the subjoined list of names. Population about 3000.

Sarnia is distant from Detroit, 60 miles; Chatham, 60; from Lon-don 60; and from Goderich 60.

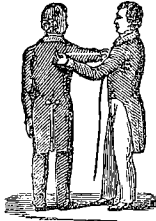

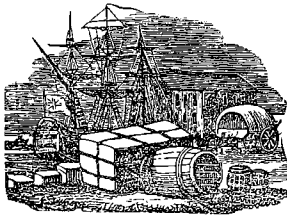

A village and station on the Sarnia branch of the Great Western Railway, is situated in the township of Plympton, 12 miles north of Oil Springs, and 5 from Petrolia, with which it is connected by a plank road, (built by E. McGarvey, Esq., from Sarnia) and 45 from London. This village derives its importance from the oil trade, large quantities of which are shipped from this point. A large business is also done in grain, timber, staves and agricultural products.

Wyoming contains three hotels, three oil refineries, a flouring and saw mills, an iron foundry and machine shop, three general stores, two groceries, cooper, blacksmith, cabinet and other shops.

The post office was established in 1858,—George Brown, sen., first P.M. Population, about 750.

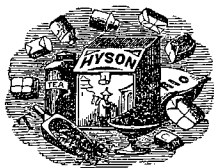

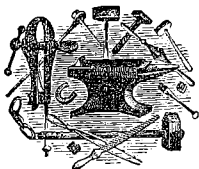
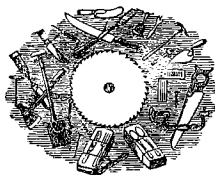

## COUNTY OF ESSEX.

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This County lies north of latitude 42, and is the most westerly as well as the most southerly in Canada. It is bounded, on the north by Lake St. Clair, on the west by the River Detroit, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the east by Lake Erie and the County of Kent.

In 1894 an act was passed for abolishing the territorial divisions of Upper Canada Districts, and for providing for temporary unions of Counties for judicial and other purposes, shortly after which Essex became a county. The first Warden of the Western District was Jacob Dolsen, of Chatham. The first Judges were Alex. Chewitt and Chas. Elliott, Esqs. Mr. Chewett was Judge for the three Counties of Essex, Kent and Lambton. Gordon W. Legatt, Esq., is the present Judge of the County of Essex. The first Sheriff was W. Hands, Esq., E. Reynolds the next. In 1802 Mr. Hands filled the offices of Sheriff, Registrar, Collector of Customs, Registrar Surrogate Court; in fact, he held all the County offices at that time, with the exception of Clerk of the peace.

John McEwan, Esq., was appointed Sheriff in 1846, and still holds that position. The Registry Office for the Western District was at one time kept in Detroit, by Mr. Monforton. John A. Askin is the present Registrar. J. B. Baby, Esq., was the first county treasurer: Thos. Henry Wright holds the office at present.

Wm. Cowan was the first District Clerk. Thos McKee, Esq., the present County Clerk was appointed in 1865.

The first Court House was situated in rear of the present, built of logs; it was replaced by a brick building, which has lately been used as barracks by the volunteers stationed at Sandwich. The present Court House, a very substantial stone structure, was erected in the year 1855, at a cost of \$32,000. In it are the offices of the Sheriff, Treasurer, County Clerk, Clerk of the Peace and County Attorney. The Division Court as also the County Courts are held here.

This section of the Province has long been settled. The Township of Sandwich, on the western border of the County, began to be inhabited as early as the year 1750, by disbanded soldiers from the French army. The land was laid out in arpents, instead of acres, according to the French mode of measuring, 180 arpents being equivalent to 200 acres.

## SOIL.

In the southern portion of the County the soil is a sandy loam, with the exception of Malden and Anderdon, which is a heavy clay; although, for a short distance on the Lake Erie shore, in some parts it is quite sandy. In the northern range the soil is a heavy clay. Many sections in the County are admirably adapted for the growth of tobacco.

## TIMBER.

The principal kinds of wood are white and red oak, hickory, beech, maple, white and black ash, basswood and elm.

The principal products are fall wheat, spring wheat, oats, barley, rye, corn, (the latter grows in great abundance), peas, tobacco, and fruits of every description.

## PRINCIPAL ROADS.

Talbot Road, gravelled from Windsor to Ouellett's Corners, a distance of six miles, built by a joint stock company in the year 1862, S. S. McDonald, president. There is about ten miles of it planked and gravelled. It enters the County of Kent, in the Township of Romney.

Middle Road commences at Maidstone, passes through a small village and P. O. station, running parallel to the railway station, entering the County of Kent at Trudell P. O., in West Tilbury, a distance of twenty-eight miles from the cross.

The Malden Road, running obliquely in a north-easterly direction, following nearly the banks of the River Canard. The Board of Works Road, built in 1842, runs from Maidstone to Amherstburg.

River Road, running from Windsor to Amherstburg, a distance of eighteen miles, is gravelled from Windsor to Sandwich, a distance of two miles.

Lake Shore Road, running from Amherstburg to Leamington, in the Township of Mersea, intersecting the Talbot Road at Leamington, passes through Malden Township, Colchester, Gosfield, and part of Mersea, a distance of thirty-three miles, terminating at Wigle's hotel.

Tecumseth Road, running along Lake St. Clair into the County of Kent, at Baptiste Creek, a distance of thirty-one miles from Windsor.

## STREAMS.

River Canard, rising partly in Sandwich Township and partly in Anderdon, dividing the south-western portion of the County. It enters the River Detroit opposite 22nd lot, Concession 1st of Anderdon, a distance of ten miles from Sandwich.

Cedar Creek takes its source in the Townships of Colchester and Gosfield, entering Lake Erie at Lot 42, Con. 1st, Township of Gosfield.

Surgeon Creek, in the Township of Mersea, entering Lake Erie at Lot 11, Con. B, said Township.

Turkey Creek, in the Township of Sandwich, empties into the Detroit River at Lot 35, Con. 1st.

Baptiste Creek, which forms the boundary line between Essex and the County of Kent, empties into the River Thames, in the north-eastern part of the Township of Tilbury West.

The Ruscom rises near the boundary line between Gosfield and Rochester, draining the eastern portion of the Township. Ruscom empties into Lake St. Clair at Lot A, 7th Concession, about four miles above Belle River.

Belle River, forming the boundary line between Maidstone and Rochester, takes its rise in Gosfield, and empties between the 1st Concessions in each of the forementioned Townships into Lake Erie.

River Aux Puces has its rise in the Township of Maidstone, near the 5th and 6th Concessions; and empties into Lake St. Clair, between Concessions 8 and 9.

River Aux Peches rises in the Township of Sandwich east, crosses between the 8th and 9th Concessions of Maidstone, and empties into Lake St. Clair at the north-west corner of Maidstone.

Little River drains the eastern portion of Sandwich east, and empties into Lake St. Clair about six miles from Windsor.

#### ISLANDS.

The principal islands belonging to Canada, are Fighting, Turkey and Bois Blanc. The former, opposite Sandwich west, contains several fisheries. The fishing season commences about the first of October.

Bois Blanc Island, opposite Amherstburg, consists of about 200 acres. A lighthouse was erected on the southern point about the year 1836; Captain James Hackett is the attendant.

#### HISTORICAL, STATISTICAL AND GENERAL INFORMATION OF TOWNSHIPS.

ANDERDON.—This Township consists of a block of land formerly owned by the Huron and Wyandotte Indians, and disposed of by them in 1837. It fronts on the Detroit River for a distance of seven miles. About one-third of the Township has been reserved by the Indians for their own use—a stone quarry, consisting of about 160 acres; these quarries are leased to private individuals, and large quantities of lime are exported. The soil is clay, with heavy black loam, well adapted for pasturage, vegetables, and all kinds of grain and fruits. The River Canard runs through the Township, and enters the Detroit River about midway between its northern and southern boundaries. It is one of the most fertile sections in the County, and the only apparent drawback, as in other sections of the Province where the red man of the forest still holds possession, is the lack of good roads and general improvements in that portion held by them. The population is mixed, consisting of English, Irish, Scotch and

French. The Concessions number from the River east, eight in all. Lots number from south to north. Mr. Forbes was one of the first settlers, having come here in 1837. In 1846 it contained a population of 608, and the rateable property at that time amounted to \$15,000. Total population in 1861, 1,505. Anderdon is bounded on the north by Sandwich, on the west by River Detroit, on the south by Malden, and on the east by the Township of Colchester.

COLCHESTER.—This Township is situated on Lake Erie, and is bounded on the north by the Townships of Maidstone and Sandwich, on the west by Anderdon and Malden, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the east by Gosfield. The first survey of it was made for the purpose of being granted to "Butler's Rangers," and to the U. E. Loyalists. Its settlement dates back as far as the year 1797. Many of the original grantees never effected a settlement, and others sold out soon after moving to their lands. John Cornwall, one of the U. E. Loyalists, was the first representative of the County in the Provincial Parliament. The greater portion of the front part of the Township was purchased and settled between the years 1797, and 1800. The soil on the lake shore is sandy and clayey loam. The banks of the lake are in some parts from sixty to eighty feet above the level of the water. In the Township are three extensive marshes, which are covered with water in the spring but are dry during the summer, and yield large quantities of hay. The largest of these marshes (Roache's) lies between the 5th and 6th Concessions, and is drained on the west by the River Canard, and on the east by Cedar Creek. On its west is a large ditch, which renders it fit for cultivation; and the Township Council wisely propose draining the eastern portion, by which it will also be reclaimed.

Part of the Township is well timbered with maple, beech, elm, oak, black walnut, &c. In 1844 it contained a population of 1,400, which in 1861 increased to 2,656.

GOSFIELD.—This Township is bounded on the north by the Townships of Rochester and Maidstone, on the west by Colchester, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the east by Mersea. It borders on Lake Erie for about ten miles, and commenced to be settled towards the Lake about the same time as Colchester, the adjoining Township, which, in point of soil, it very nearly resembles; about half the land is wet and requires draining. The first settlers here were, "Butler's Rangers." The Township is watered by Hughson's Creek, Belle River, Ruscom River and Cedar Creek. It is wooded by white oak, ash, elm, beech, maple, walnut, and basswood. There is a large marsh in the western section of the Township, in front of the Talbot road, which could be converted into productive soil by proper drainage.

In 1844 Gosfield contained a population of 1338. The population in 1861 numbered 2355.

**MAIDSTONE.**—This Township borders on Lake St. Clair for a distance of ten miles. It is bounded on the east by the Townships of Sandwich, on the west by Belle River, and on the south by the Townships of Colchester and Gosfield. The river Aux Pucies runs through its centre. The soil is a heavy clay, and the whole of the land in the Township is fit for cultivation. It is timbered by maple, elm, beech, oak, &c. The Township, on the rivers and the lake, was settled by French principally. The population in 1844 numbered 783, and had increased in 1861 to 1652.

**MALDEN.**—This Township is situated partly on the Detroit River, that is the western part, and the southern part on Lake Erie. It was laid out in 1797 by Thomas Smith, P.L.S. The portion of the Township bordering on Lake Erie is rather marshy; the rest of the Township is dry, and consists of a clayey loam, drained by Caldwell's Creek, also Bondy's Creek, both of which are branches of the River Canard. It is timbered by white oak, walnut, hickory, beech, maple, ash, &c. The first settlers were Cols. Elliott and Caldwell. This Township is well settled, and contains some of the finest farming lands in the County. Population, in 1845, 1,934

**MERSEA.**—Is bounded on the north by the Township of Tilbury West; on the west by Gosfield; on the south by Lake Erie, and on the east by Romney. An extensive triangular shaped point of land, embracing about one-third of the Township, called "Point au Pele, or South Foreland," runs out into the Lake for about eight miles. The Township is watered by Sturgeon Creek on the west side of the Point, and Muddy Creek on the east side, and north by a branch of Baptiste Creek. It was first settled in the year 1801 by Edward Hazle, Thomas Bell, Charles Usher, Theodore Malott, — Wilkinson and William Fleming. The soil in the south-west corner is sandy, the balance is a clayey loam. Total population, in 1861, 2,143.

**SANDWICH EAST.**—Is situated on Lake St. Clair and Detroit River, and was settled about the same time as Sandwich West, (1750); and a new settlement made by Col. Talbot about the year 1827, on what is called Talbot street. The shrewdness of Col. Talbot is evident from the fact that the whole tract of his land was situated in the most elevated portion of the County, which appears to have been also the case in the other Counties in which he owned lands, viz: Kent, Elgin and Norfolk. The soil in this Township is a sandy loam, drained by Turkey Creek on the west, on the north and east by Little River. The eastern portion of the Township is principally settled by English, Irish and Scotch. In 1861 Sandwich East contained a population of 3,133.

**SANDWICH WEST.**—This Township is almost entirely settled and occupied, with the exception of a few hundred acres. The soil is principally a black sandy loam on the river side, which is well adapted for almost all kinds of produce. The eastern part is a clay

loam, drained by the river Canard and Turkey Creek. A great quantity of the produce formerly went to the Detroit market. The Township has a gradual elevation from the river; it has a frontage of eleven miles on the Detroit River. It contained a population of 1,815 in 1861.

**ROCHESTER.**—This Township is situated on Lake St. Clair, and is watered by the River Ruscom on the east; Belle River and Duck Creek on the west. Soil, a heavy clayey loam. The land is flat towards the Lake, but rises gradually as you go back. This Township is timbered with white ash, elm, oak, hickory, beech, maple and basswood. Concessions run from west to east. Rochester was first settled by French. It is bounded on the north by Lake St. Clair; on the west by Belle River; on the south by Gosfield, and on the east by Tilbury West. In 1861 the population numbered 1,349.

**TILBURY WEST.**—Extends along the Lake for nine miles. It runs gradually to the height of about forty feet above the level of the Lake, and is watered by Baptiste and Silver Creeks; soil, a heavy clayey loam, and is timbered with white oak, elm, ash, hickory, beech and maple. The first settlers were principally French. Population, in 1845, 437; in 1861 the population numbered 1,190.

#### EDUCATIONAL.

In the very important matter of education, great progress has been effected in the County of Essex, and it has now the advantages of a liberal and permanent provision for the general and thorough education of its rising population, fully enjoying the privileges and benefits conferred by the excellent School Act for Upper Canada (13th and 14th Vic., cap. 48, 1850). The reports of the Local Superintendents of Schools for the County, in general, indicate a growing interest in the subject of education, and a steady progress in the different Sections and Townships that is highly satisfactory. Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three Trustees are elected to manage its School affairs. Each School and Municipal Corporation desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connection with the Department.

There is a good grammar school in Windsor, managed by a Board of Trustees composed of the following gentlemen: Jas. Dougall, Francis Caron, and Donald Cameron, Esquires.

The following are the number of common schools in the several municipalities:—Sandwich East, 8; West, 7; Gosfield, 10; (one colored school) Mersea, 6; Maidstone, 6; Malden, 5; Anderdon, 5; Colchester, 14; Tilbury West, 5; Rochester, 4; Windsor, 5; Sandwich, 5; Amherstburg, 5; making a total of 94 schools in the County. In addition to which there are a number of private schools.

The Local Superintendents for the different municipalities are as

follows:—Colchester, James Bell; Gosfield, James King; Mersea, Jonathan Wigfield; Anderdon, Rev. F. Mack; Malden, George Gott; Rochester, Joseph Mathers; Maidstone, Wm. Lindsay; Sandwich East, Dennis Downing; Sandwich West, Dr. F. Dupois; Tilbury West Alex., Craig.

### GOSFIELD.

A Post Office, situated in the Township of Gosfield, on Lake Erie shore, south-west corner of Lot 7, on the 1st Concession, Eastern Division, thirty miles from Windsor, and the same distance from Sandwich, the County town. The Post Office was established in 1826, Peter Scratch, first Postmaster; Joseph Coatsworth, present Postmaster.

There is a small village about a mile below Gosfield, Post Office, called Union, containing a store, coopershop one hotel one blacksmith shop.

### HARROW.

A post village, situated on lots 9 and 10, 2nd concession of the Township of Colchester; distance from Amherstburg, 13 miles; from Sandwich, the county town, 29 miles. Mrs. Munger, Post Mistress. The village now contains a steam saw and grist mill, two blacksmith shops, one shoe shop, and one general store, one church, and two schools.

I. O. of G. T.—STAR OF COLCHESTER, No. 533, organized January 1865.—Meet Saturday evenings in their hall, situated on lot 69 of the 1st concession of the Township of Colchester.

### KINGSVILLE.

A post village, situated in the Township of Gosfield, on lots 1 and 2 W. D., and 1 E. D., 1st Concession. This thriving village was laid out in 1844, by James Kinley. It is about three quarters of a mile from Lake Erie, 26 miles from Sandwich, the County Town, and 28 from Windsor. The Post Office was established in 1854. The first settlers in this section were: Leonard Scratch, one of the U. E. Loyalists, who settled here as early as the year 1790; Martin Tuffelmin, James Girty, in 1791; Edward Hagle, W. Wible, Philip Fox and James Stewart. The first mill was built here by Henry Harris in the year 1850, and the first store was opened in 1846 by Lewis Jaspersen. Samuel Rose opened out the first hotel in the year 1845.

The village now contains five general stores, one grocery, one grist mill, one tannery, an ashery, two carriage factories, one cooper shop, two harness shops, two shoe shops, one watchmaker shop, one butcher shop, two tailor shops, one tin shop, one foundry, a sash, door and blind factory, one spinning wheel factory, two cabinet shops, two hotels, one Temperance house, and a Custom House—James King, Collector; three churches, a good school, one saw mill, nursery, a brick and tile manufactory, two carpenter shops, one basket factory, one paint shop, a bakery, drug store, &c., one Free Mason's lodge, one Good Templar's lodge, one Agricultural society. There is a dock at which about six vessels can lie at a time. The principal business done here is in the shipping of grain, lumber, cordwood and general

merchandise. The country around is well settled, and in a high state of cultivation. The population is now about 500. There are two daily stages each way. George Cooper, Postmaster.

The Third Division Court is held here, of which Col. James King is Clerk, Geo. Malott, Bailiff; a Town Hall, built in 1852, in which the Council of Gosfield meets.

#### LEAMINGTON.

A post village, situated within one mile and a half of Lake Erie, in the Township of Mersea, on Lot No. 6 in the 2d Con., and Lots 2 and 4 South Talbot Road N. and S., distant thirty-four miles from Sandwich, County Town, and thirty-four miles from Windsor, was first laid out by John Williamson and John McGaw.

The Post Office was established in the year 1855, Warren Kimball the first and present Postmaster. The first store was opened in 1854, by James Flood; the first hotel by Leonard Wigle, in the year 1836. The first mill was started in 1855, by William Gains. The village now contains three general stores, two shoe shops, one harness shop, two grist and saw mills, one carding mill, one waggon and carriage shop and general blacksmith shop, one tin shop, one chair factory, two carpenter shops, one cabinet shop, two hotels, one tailor shop, one cooper shop, two physicians, two churches—one Regular Baptist and one Episcopal Methodist. There is a school within half a mile of the village, R. T. Moore, teacher; one Good Templar Lodge, and one Orange Lodge. Population, 300.

There is a Town Hall here, at which the Township Council of Mersea meets.

McGee, in 1850, who was also the Postmaster, the Post Office being established in 1850. The first store was opened by John McGee. The Roman Catholic Church was erected here in 1836, a log building, it was replaced by a substantial brick building in 1850. The village now contains two stores, three blacksmith shops—two of the same, manufacture waggons—one butcher, two shoe shops, two hotels, one church, one St. Patrick's Society, and a good school; there is a saw mill within one mile west of the village, carried on by James Alfred, on lot 296, Talbot Street, south. Mails daily, Thomas Moran, Postmaster.

An Agricultural Society, organized January, 1866, Patrick McNally, President; John Halford, Vice-President; James Devlin, Secretary; James Moran, Treasurer.

Population about 50. Two stages call here daily from Leamington.

### MERSEA.

Situated on lot 218, South Talbot Road, in the Township of Mersea; four miles from Leamington, established in the year 1825. William Ambridge, first Postmaster. Jonathan Wigfield, present Postmaster.

It contains a good steam saw mill, built by Mr. Salmoni, and afterwards purchased by Mr. Ryde, who carries it on at present, store, blacksmith shop, hotel, two shoe shops and a good school, Miss Wright is teacher. John Mickie is present postmaster.

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### ROCHESTER.

A post village, and station of the Great Western Railway (Bell River Station) is situated on the first lot of the first concession, township of Rochester, at a distance from Sandwich, the county town, of nineteen miles. The village was first laid out in 1852, by Philip S. Donnelly, and the post office was established in 1854—P. Dumouchelle, Post Master. Mails received daily. The first grist and saw mill was built in 1852 by Ouellette & Co., which was destroyed by fire in 1856, and rebuilt by the same parties, and is now carried on by C. S. Chesom. The village contains at present one dry goods store, four groceries, one grist and saw mill, one carding and fulling mill, one waggon shop, three blacksmith shops, one cooper shop, one harness shop, two shoe shops, one pearlash factory, one potash factory, two lime kilns, and cabinet shop, three hotels, a good school and church (Roman Catholic)—Rev. E. L. M. Johnson, pastor. Population, 300.

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### RUTHVEN.

A post village, situated on lots 9 and 10, 2nd concession of the Township of Gosfield, at a distance from Lake Erie of one mile. It is distant thirty miles from Sandwich, the County Town. This village was laid out in the year 1862, by Hugh Ruthven, Esq., and now contains a population of one hundred, two general stores, one grocery, one shoe shop, and two blacksmith shops—in connection with one of these there is a carriage and waggon shop—two hotels, a steam grist, carding and saw mill—carried on by Mr. Ruthven—a cabinet shop, a good school and an Orange Society. There is also an oil well in operation. Mails received daily.

RUTHVEN LOYAL ORANGE LODGE, No. 1197, organized January, 1866. Meets last Tuesday each month.

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### AMHERSTBURG.

The Town of Amherstburg is situated on the Detroit River, in the Township of Malden, about sixteen miles distant from Sandwich, in a south westerly direction. It was formerly a garrison, but no troops have been stationed here since 1851, since which time the buildings, which were capable of holding a regiment, have been converted into

a Lunatic Asylum. Amherstburg was laid out as a town in the year 1795, and the following year after the evacuation of Detroit, it began to be settled. It was surveyed by the Ordnance Department, when lots sold for \$40. Most of the houses are built in the old French style, and the streets are narrow, which gives the place a very old-fashioned appearance. The banks of the Detroit are low and sandy for some miles after leaving Sandwich, but about two miles and a-half from Amherstburg the banks rise suddenly to a considerable height, and continue so to where the river emerges into the lake; below the town the banks are remarkably beautiful, upon which are erected several handsome private residences. About a mile below the town is a Chalybeate Spring, the water of which is said to resemble that of Cheltenham in England. The water was first discovered making its exit from below the wall of an old barn, and from its depositing a considerable quantity of iron wherever it ran, first attracted attention. This water is said to possess medicinal properties.

In 1846, Amherstburg contained a population of 985; it now numbers about 2,500, and the town is in a prosperous condition generally. The first hotel was opened by Wm. Searl, in 1815. The first grist mill was built by Wm. McGee, in 1832. John McLeod built the first saw mill in 1840. The town now contains seven general stores, one grist mill, one saw mill, nine hotels, six waggon shops, four harness shops, ten blacksmith shops, twelve groceries, one physician, two drug stores, five schools, and five churches. Mails daily. James Kevill, postmaster.

## SANDWICH.

The County Town and judicial seat of the County of Essex is beautifully situated in the midst of a fine and well settled agricultural country, on the Detroit River, about two miles below Windsor, and nine miles below Lake St. Clair. This is one of the oldest towns in the Western section of Canada, having been the district town of the Western District, where all the judicial business of the three Counties, viz., Essex, Kent, and Lambton, was transacted; and one would be naturally disposed to inquire why it did not keep pace with other towns and villages throughout the country—having now only a population of about one thousand, whereas the population of its rival town, Windsor, numbers about four thousand five hundred. The reason, no doubt, for the more rapid increase of population in the latter place—and consequently its greater increase in wealth and general importance was the fact of its having more immediate connection with the City of Detroit upon the opposite shore, and also its being upon the line of the Great Western Railway. Notwithstanding, Sandwich has her attractions, being surrounded by highly improved and beautiful farms, among which might be mentioned the Prince estate, owned now by Charles Prince, Esq., a son of old Colonel Prince, formerly member of Parliament for the Western District. Upon this place there is an orchard extending over twenty acres, containing the choicest fruits of every description. The farm in all contains about 300 acres, in which there are beautiful oak groves, evincing remarkable taste.

It contains at present one grist and carding mill, two tanneries, one sash, door and blind factory, one saw mill, one foundry, a brick yard, shingle factory, two waggon shops, bakery, one gunsmith, seven general stores, four groceries, five hotels, one boot and shoe factory, two potash factories, and one brewery, five churches and several schools.

A small village, situated on the river side, about a mile above Windsor. It contains a distillery, carried on by Hiram Walker & Co.; a hotel, and several tenements, built by Walker & Co., for the convenience of their employees, which number from eighty to one hundred.

### WHEATLEY.

A post village, situated on lots 218, north and south of the Talbot road, in the Township of Mersea. The village was surveyed by Alexander Wilkinson, and the post office was established in 1864—Alexander Buchanan, post master. It now contains two stores, one shoe shop, one blacksmith shop, one cabinet shop, two hotels and an Orange Lodge.

### WINDSOR.

The largest and most important town in the County of Essex, is pleasantly situated on the Detroit River, in the Township of Sandwich, opposite Detroit, and is distant from Chatham forty-six miles, and from London 110 miles. The town being built on a high bank from thirty to forty feet above the river, renders the situation healthy and desirable as a place of residence, which is a very important consideration to business men and others, and which, no doubt, induced many of the present residents of Windsor to invest their capital there, and make it their home. It was first laid out in the year 1834, since which time it has been steadily increasing in population, wealth and importance.

Windsor will ever be associated with the rebellion of 1837, which commenced by an armed invasion of Toronto, headed by William Lyon McKenzie. As a community the residents sided warmly with Sir Francis Bond Head and his advisers, under whose mal-administration the unhappy crisis took place—prudently thinking it was better to defend the Government than incur the evils of a civil war. At that time a band of Americans and rebels, 400 in number, crossed over from Detroit, and burned the steamer Thames and two or three houses. They were charged by a party of militia, eighty in number, who, after firing two shots, completely routed them. Shortly after this the insurrection was suppressed, and the invaders from the opposite shore who sympathised with the Canadian rebels, and had been led to suppose that the people in this Province were waiting to rise *en masse*, fled in haste to their native soil. About that time barracks were erected, which were occupied by several companies of volunteers from

different parts of the Province, during the winter, spring and summer of this year.

In 1846 Windsor contained a population of only 300—increased in 1861 to 2,500. There are at present about 4,500 inhabitants in the place, principally composed of native-born Canadians, English, Irish, Scotch and Americans.

Windsor enjoys excellent facilities for manufactures and commerce, being the western terminus of the Great Western Railway, and also having the benefit of navigation during summer, with excellent roads leading out of the town in every direction. Constant traffic was formerly carried on between here and Detroit, which gave an impetus to business generally, and did much towards the prosperity of the place.

The Great Western Railway dock is situated opposite the foot of the first gravel road—it is 700 feet long, and extends into the river to a depth of twenty-eight feet. The basin for the boat is constructed in the shape of a basket, having a shipping table suited to the rise and fall of the boat, which can be raised or lowered eight feet.

There are at present three steam ferries, viz.: Detroit, Capt. Chilver; Argo, Capt. Forbes; and the Essex, owned by the Messrs. Jenkin.

Windsor was incorporated as a village in January, 1854, and as a town in 1858. S. S. McDonald, Esq., was first reeve, and also first mayor. Mr. Bartlett has held the office of town clerk since 1858. The first store was opened out by James Dougall, about 1830, and Hiram Walker built the first mill in a place called Walkerville, about a mile above Windsor. In 1835, an agency of the Commercial Bank was established here, of which C. D. Grasett is present manager.

Windsor contains one newspaper, the *Essex Record*, published by P. J. Lawrie.

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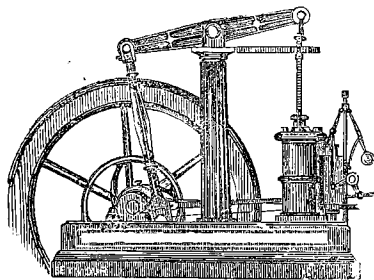
