

#### C A P. XXXIV.

An Act for giving Relief to fuch Persons as have suffered in their Rights and Properties, during the late unhappy Dissentions in America, in consequence of their Loyalty to His Majesty, and Attachment to the British Government; for making Compensation to Persons who surnished Provisions, or other necessary Articles, to the Army or Navy in America during the War, or whose Property was used, seized, or destroyed for the carrying on the publick Service there; and also for making Compensation to such Persons as have suffered in their Properties, in consequence of the Cession of the Province of East Florida to the King of Spain.

Preamble.



DERGAS Inquiries have been made, under the Authority of several Acts of Parliament, made and passed in the Twenty-third, Twenty-fifth, Twenty= firth, Twenty-feventh, Twenty-eighth, and Twenty-ninth Pears of Pour Ba= dieth's Reign, into the Lottes of all fuch

Persons as have suffered in their Rights and Properties, during the late unhappy Dissentions in America, in confequence of their Loyalty to your Wajelly, and Attach= ment to the British Government; and into the Claims of Persons who surnished Provisions or other necessary Articles to the Army or Pavy in America during the late Mar, or whose Property was used, seized, or destroyed, for the carrying on the publick Service there; and also under the Authority of an Ad, made in the Twenty-Exth Pear of Pour Bajeftp's Reign, into the Loffes of all fuch Persons as have suffered in their Properties, in consequence of the Cession of the Province of East Florida to the King of Spain: And whereas it is consident with Bour Bajeftp's Bunificence, and the honour and Charafter of the British Mation, that liberal Relief hould be given in Consideration of the Losses of all such Perfons as have suffered in their Rights and Properties as afozelaid: Way it therefoze please your Bajefty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majetty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lozds Spiritual and Tempozal, and Commons, in this present Parliament allembled, and by the Authority Commissioners of the same, That the Commissioners appointed by the for enquiring faid Ads to enquire into the Losses and Services of such Persons who have suffered in their Rights, Properties. and Profesions, during the late unhappy Dissentions in America, and into the Claims and Loffes afozefaid, Ball. on or before the Rifth Day of July One thousand seven hundled and ninety, make up and transmit to the Commissioners of his Wajesty's Treasury, now or for the Time being, a Book oz Books figned by themselves, oz 2 anp

II. And be it further enacted, That the ftanding Diders which thall be made out at the Erchequer in pursuance and under the Authozity of this Ad, thall be allignable on the Back of such Diders, on the Assignment being attested by Two or more credible Mitneffes, which Alignment hall intitle the Alignee, his Executors, Administrators, and Amgns, to the Benefit attending such Dider of Diders, and to the Interest which shall become due and payable in respect of the same.

III. And be it enacted, That the Commissioners of the Treasury now being, or any Three or more of them, or the High Treasurer for the Time being, shall be, and they are hereby authorized, impowered, and required, out of any of the Aids of Supplies that thall be granted for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundzed and ninety, to direct the Payment at the Receipt of the Er= chequer of the principal Sums contained in all and every the several and respective Diders made foith foi any Sum or Sums of Woney less than Kifty Pounds, on the Tenth Day of October One thousand seven hundred and ninety. together with the Interest thereon, computed from the faid fifth Day of July One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight, to the said Tenth Day of October One thousand seven hundred and ninety.

Commissioners Certifi-cates of the Sums to which they are inti-tled, to be transmitted to the Trea-fury, &c.

IV. And be it further enacted by the Authority afores ers to deliver to the Suffer- said, That in older to prevent such Diders from being fraudulently obtained from the Auditor of the Erchequer, or his Officers, by any other Person or Persons than those who hall be duly entitled to the same, the faid respective Commissioners appointed for ascertaining the Losses afozementioned, thall make forth and deliver to each and every Person named in the said Books. or to his or her lawful Attorney, to be transmitted by them to the Commissioners of His Wajesp's Creasury, a Certificate containing the Dame and Addition of such Claimant, and the Sum to which he or the thall be intitled; which Certificate Hall be carried to the proper Officer in the Office of the said Auditor of the Erchequer, who, upon Beceipt thereof, shall deliver the Dider made out for the Benefit of such Person, and shall take a Receipt on the Back of such Certificate as a Discharge for the laid Dider.

V. And be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That Orders to be the Diders directed to be made out for the Purposes in arithmetithis Ad mentioned, hall be numbered in an Arithmetical Dider, beginning with Mumber One, and so pioceeding. in an Arithmetical Progression ascending, wherein the common Ercels of Difference shall always be One, and hall be registered accordingly.

VI. And be it further enacted by the Authority afore: Clauses of Mait Act to said, That all and every the Clauses, Provides, Powers, extend to this Act, experimental experiments, Advantages, Penalties, Forseitures, and charge the Disabilities, contained in an At made and passed in this Loans, &c. Section of Parliament, intituled, An Act for continuing and granting to His Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety, (ercept such Clauses as charge the Loans or Exchequer Bills authorised to be made by the faid Ad, and except fuch Clauses as limit the Rate of Interest to be paid for the Forbearance of Monep lent on the Credit of the said Ad, and except the Dis rections for making forth Tallies for Loans made out), thall be applied and extended to the Diders which thall be made out in pursuance of this Ad, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purpoles, as if the faid Clauses were repeated and resenaded in the Body of this present At.

VII. Provided always, and be it enacted by the Autho: Treasury may rity aforesaid, That in case any of the said Diders made ders to be forth by virtue of this At thall be filled up by Wariting lieu of such as or Indorsements thereon, or by any Accident be defaced, faced, see it hall and may be lawful for the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three or more of them, or the high Treasurer for the Time being, and he and they are hereby authorised and impowered by his or their Direc= tion, from Time to Time, to cause new Diders to be made forth at the Receipt of the Erchequer, in lieu of luch Diders which hall be so tilled up or defaced, which Diders to filled up or defaced thall be cancelled at the Receipt of the Erchequer, and kept there on a Kile of Kiles 8 H

for that Purpole; and such Diders so to be made forth in lieu thereof hall, in all Respects, be subject to the same Rules, Dethods, and Continuance, and have and be intitled to the same and like Benefits and Advantages, and bear the same Pumbers, Dates, and principal Sums, as was or were borne by such Order or Orders so cancelled.

Treasury may reward Persons employed in the Execution of this Act.

VIII. Provided always, and it is hereby enaded by the Authority aforesaid, That out of any of the Aids or Supplies to be granted to his Wajesty for the Service of the Pears One thousand seven hundzed and ninety, One thousand seven hundled and ninety-one, One thousand seven hundzed and ninety-two, Dne thousand seven hundied and ninety-thiee. One thousand seven hundled and ninety-four, One thousand feven hundzed and ninety= five. One thousand seven hundred and ninetpelir. One thousand seven hundled and ninety-seven, and One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, or out of such Monies as Hall of may remain in the Erchequer of the Consolidated Fund, it Hall and may be lawful to and for the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three or more of them, or the High Treasurer for the Time being, to reward such Person or Persons that shall or may be in any Mays employed in the Erecution of this At for their Labour, Pains, and Service therein respectively, and to latisfy and discharge such incidental Charges and Expences as thall necessarily attend the Execution of the same, in such Wanner as the said Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three or more of them, or the high Treasurer for the Time being, hall from Time to Time think fit and reasonable in that Behalf.

If Supplies be not granted for Payment of Orders, they shall be paid out of the Consolidated Fund.

IX. And be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That in case sufficient Aids or Supplies hall not be granted before the Kifth Day of April One thousand seven hund died and ninety-one, or before the Kifth Day of April in each subsequent Pear, before the Whole of the said Oted, berein directed to be made forth, are satisfied and paid off with Interest sor the same, then such Sum as should or ought to be satisfied and paid pursuant to this At, in Part of the principal Sum of such Diders, toge-

ther with the Interest that hall then have become due, hall be charged upon such Wonies as, at any Time after the said Kifth Day of April in each year, hall be of remain in the Exchequer of the Consolidated Fund, (except such Monies of the said Consolidated Fund as are appropriated to any Use or Uses by any At or Ats of Parliament in that Behalf); and such Monies of the faid Consolidated Fund hall and may be issued and avplied, as foon as the same can be regularly stated and ascertained, for and towards paying off such Instalment of Instalments, and the Interest due and papable on the several Olders, according to the Directions of this At: any At or Ats of Parliament, or any Clause or Clauses in any Att of Ats of Parliament, to the contrary notwithstanding.

And it is hereby enacted by the Authority afores Persons forgfaid, That if any Person of Persons thall forge of coun- ing Orders, to suffer terfeit any Dider, which shall have been made forth by virtue of this Act, before the same thall have been paid off and cancelled, or any Dider to be renewed or made forth in nursuance of this Ad, or any Indoctement or Writing thereupon of therein, of tender in Payment any such forged or counterfeit Dider, with Intent to defraud His Pajetty, his heirs and Successors, or the Person or Perfons to be appointed to pay off the same, or to pay any Interest thereupon, or any of them, then every such Perfon of Persons so offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, Hall be adjudged a Felon, and Hall suffer Death as in Cases of Kelony, without Benefit of Clergy.
