# A BILL

*To Amend the Law for Apprenticing Minors, &c.*

WHEREAS the Act of the Common Council of this City passed on the 7th day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-six, entitled "An Act to authorise the Apprenticeship of Minors in certain cases, and to Regulate the Duties of Masters and Apprentices," requires amendment, so as to be binding on all Masters and Apprentices throughout the said city and liberties, whether the binding of such Apprentices be made under the said Act or not:—Be it therefore enacted by the Mayor, Alderman, and Commonality of the City of Toronto, in Common Council assembled.

## SECTION I.

That the words, "under the authority of this Act," in the sixth, seventh, and tenth sections of the said Act be, and the same are hereby expunged and repealed, and the said sixth and seventh clauses shall hereafter refer to, and be binding upon all Masters, Mistresses of, and Apprentices who shall have been bound before the passing of the said Act: And that the words, "under this Act," in the eleventh section of the said Act be, and the same are hereby expunged and repealed, and the said eleventh section shall hereafter refer to, and be binding upon all Masters, Mistresses of, and Apprentices who shall have been bound before the passing of the said Act, as well to as those who may be bound after the passing thereof.
