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FIRST DAY,

TUESDAY, June 2nd, 1863.

The Council met in the Court Room this day at 2 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment.

The Warden in the Chair.

Roll called.

Members all present (with the exception of Messrs. Bickle and Thompson.)

The Warden addressed the Council upon various matters transpiring during the recess.

Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves, That this Council do now proceed to select a Committee of seven members by ballot, for the purpose of equalizing the assessment rolls for 1862, and report thereon.

Carried.

The Council proceeded to ballot, and the Warden declared the Committee to be composed of Messrs. Brethour, Button, Campbell, Fairbanks, Kennedy, Nelson and Perry.

PETITIONS PRESENTED.

Of the Corporation of the Township of Thorah, praying for certain information respecting charges on Non-Resident Land Fund.—Mr. McNab:

The Warden read and laid on the table the Auditors' Report for 1862, with abstract and detailed statement in duplicate.

Mr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Nelson, moves, that during the present Session, the Warden each day leave the Chair at half past 12 o'clock, noon, for one hour and a half, and at 6 o'clock p. m., for one hour.

Carried.

And on motion of Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Gamble, the Council adjourned.

The Council met at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

The Warden in the Chair.

Members all present.

The Warden read, and laid upon the table, the County Engineer's report.

NOTICES OF MOTION.

Mr. Campbell gives notice that he will on to-morrow move for leave to bring in By-law to confirm a By-law passed by the Corporation of Reach, vesting a certain road allowance, between Lots 12 and 13, in the 3rd concession of Reach, in Wm. Holtby.

Mr. Guy gives notice that he will on to-morrow move for leave to introduce a By-law to confirm a By-law passed by the Municipality of East Whitby, for the stopping up and sale of part of road allowance between Lots Nos. 10 and 11, in broken front concession of the Township of East Whitby.

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**THIRD DAY,****THURSDAY, June 4, 1863.**

The Council met.

The Warden in the Chair.

Roll called.

Members all present.

The Warden read, and laid upon the Table, the Treasurer's financial report; also, communication from R. E. Campbell, enclosing copy of the report of a Committee of the honorable, the Executive Council, approved by His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the 19th day of May, 1863.

**PETITIONS PRESENTED.**

Of George Leask, and 49 others, praying for aid on the side line between lots 25 and 26, in the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th concessions of the Township of Scott.—Mr. Nelson.

Of Wm. Smith, and 215 others, praying for the alteration of By-law, so as to have the assessment for the Township of Scott paid to County Treasurer by first of January in each year.—Mr. Button.

Mr. Sangster, seconded by Mr. Gamble, moves, that a Committee be appointed to enquire into the desirability and practicability of establishing a County Poor House, or industrial farm, for the reception of the indigent people of this County, and that the Committee be composed of Messrs. Thompson, White, Campbell, and the mover, and report at their earliest convenience.

Carried.

Mr. Gamble, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves, That a Special Committee, to be composed of Mrs. White, Thompson, Button, McNab, and the mover, be appointed, to take into considera-

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tion the matter of the Port Whitby and Lake Scugog Road and Harbor, and report to this Council, at its present Session, as to what action it is advisable to take in reference thereto.

And the question being proposed,

Mr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Brethour, in amendment moves, that the words select committee be struck out, and the words standing committee on roads and bridges, be inserted.

And the question being proposed on the amendment, it was decided in the negative.

And the question being again proposed upon the original motion, as moved by Mr. Gamble, and seconded by Mr. Marsh,

Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Rowe, in amendment moves, That the resolution now under consideration be amended by adding the names of Messrs. Fairbanks and Bickle, and also, that the said Committee be instructed to obtain an investigation of the Company's books, and the correspondence between the Government and the said Company.

And the question being proposed upon the amendment, it was resolved in the affirmative.

And the original motion, as amended, was adopted.

Mr. Fairbanks, seconded by Mr. Sangster, moves, that Isaac Robinson, a constable of the County, be authorized to convey George Spencer, a lunatic now in custody in Cobourg Gaol, to the Asylum in Toronto, and that the Warden be authorized to grant his order upon the County Treasurer, in favor of said Robinson, for the necessary expenses accrued in conveying said lunatic to the Asylum.

Carried.

The special Committee appointed to revise and equalize the

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value of lands in the several Municipalities, brought up their report, which was read, and—

On motion of Mr. Fairbanks, seconded by Mr. Campbell, the Council went into Committee thereon.

Mr. Bickle in the Chair.

On motion of Mr. White, the Committee rose, reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

Report received and adopted.

Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves for leave to introduce a By-law to confirm By-law No. 312, of the Corporation of Reach, and that the same be now read a first time.

Leave granted.

And the By-law was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, the Council went into Committee thereon.

Mr. Brethour in the Chair.

Committee rose, and reported the By-law without amendments.

Report received and adopted.

And on motion of Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, the bill was read a third time, and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Bickle, moves, that the By-law to confirm a By-law passed by the Corporation of the Township of East Whitby, for stopping up and sale of a certain road allowance in A. S. Whiting and E. C. Tuttle, be now read a first time.

Leave granted.

And the bill was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Bickle, the



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By-law was read a second time.

And the Council went into Committee thereon.

Mr. Button in the Chair.

Committee rose, and reported the By-law with certain amendments.

Report received and adopted.

And the bill was read a third time, and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Fairbanks, moves for leave to introduce a By-law to confirm a By-law passed by the Corporation of East Whitby, vesting part of a certain road allowance in S. B. Fairbanks, and that the By-law be now read a first time.

Leave granted.

And the By-law was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Fairbanks, the bill was read a second and third time, and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Kennedy, seconded by Mr. McNab, moves, That a Special Committee be appointed, composed of Messrs. Fairbanks, White, Campbell, Perry and Thompson, for the purpose of investigating the amount collected by the Sheriff of the County, in the shape of costs for the advertisement and sale of Wild Lands in arrears for taxes in this County, in the years 1860 and 1862, respectively, and the disbursements paid by him therefor, with a view to ascertain the amount of surplus, if any, collected over and above the disbursements, and report to this Council at this or some future meeting.

On motion of Mr. Perry, the Council resumed in committee of the whole on the report of the Standing Committee on equalization of the Assessment Rolls for 1862.

Mr. Bickle in the chair

Committee rose and reported the report without amendments.

And the bill was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Sangster, the bill was read a second time, and the Council went in Committee thereon.

Mr. Gamble in the Chair.

The Committee rose, reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

Report received.

The Standing Committee on Printing brought up their report, which was read.

And on motion of Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Marsh, the Council went into Committee thereon.

Mr. Kennedy in the Chair.

Committee rose, and reported the report without amendments.

Report received and adopted.

Mr. Guy, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves, that the Treasurer be authorised, and he is hereby required to pay the several accounts mentioned in the report of the Standing Committee on Printing.

Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves for leave to introduce a By-law to confirm By-law No. 303, of the Township of Reach, and that the same be now read a first time.

Leave granted.

And the By-law was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, the bill was read a second and third time, and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to

be affixed thereto.

The Standing Committee on County Property and Gaol Management, brought up their report, which was read.

And on motion of Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Rowe, the Council went into Committee thereon.

Mr. Guy in the Chair.

Committee rose, and reported the report with amendments.

Report received and adopted.

Mr. Rowe, seconded by Mr. White, moves, that the Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay the several accounts mentioned in the report of the Standing Committee on County Property.

Carried.

The Council resumed, on motion of Mr. Thompson, in Committee of the whole, on By-law No.—, to assess the County of Ontario for Educational purposes.

Mr. Gamble in the Chair.

Committee rose, and reported the bill without amendments.

Report received and adopted.

And the bill was read a third time and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Wixson, seconded by Mr. Gamble, moves, that the Treasurer be instructed, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the Warden of this County, the sum of one hundred dollars, for the purpose of covering his disbursements.

Carried.

Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Marsh, moves, that the Messenger receive the sum of two dollars per day for his services during the present Session, and that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the same.

And the question being proposed.

Mr. Wixson, seconded by Mr. Bickle, in amendment moves, That the Warden grant his order on the Treasurer in favor of Henry Hannam, for the sum of \$1 50 per day, as remuneration for his services as Messenger during the present Session of this Council.

And the question being proposed, it was decided in the negative.

And the bill was read a third time and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Fairbanks, seconded by Mr. Button, moves, That the Warden do grant his order to the several persons, and for the respective amounts recommended to be paid by the report of the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, adopted by this Council.

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**FIFTH DAY,****SATURDAY, June 6th, 1863.**

The Council met.

The Warden in the Chair.

Roll called.

Members all present.

Minutes read approved.

Mr. White obtained leave to present the petition of E. B. Orvis, and eight others, praying for the formation of a road division on the town-line between Whitby and Pickering.

Mr. Fairbanks obtained leave to present the petition of John McGill, praying for remittance of a certain fine.

Mr. Brethour, seconded by Mr. Nelson, moves, That the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, be authorized to attend, on behalf of this Council, at the County Council of York and Peel, now in Session in the City of Toronto, for the purpose of arranging and completing all matters in question between the Corporations of York and Peel, and Ontario, relative to the construction of the Black River bridge between the Townships of Scott in Ontario, and Georgina in the County of York.

Carried.

Mr. Fairbanks, seconded by Mr. Rowe, That the Treasurer be authorized to return to John McGill \$10, being the amount of a fine paid by the said John McGill.

Carried.

Mr. White brought up the report of the Special Committee to whom was referred the consideration of the order in Council, authorizing the resumption of the Port Whitby Harbor, and Windsor and Seugog Road by the Government, and moves for the adoption of the same.

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Carried.

Mr. Bickle, seconded by Mr. Willis, moves, That the Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized to pay to Joseph Dickey and D. Beach, the sum of forty dollars each, on account of Auditors' salaries for the present year.

Carried.

Mr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Bickle, moves for leave to introduce a By-law to assess the County of Ontario, for County purposes, the sum of \$15,000 for the present year, and that the same be now read a first time.

Leave granted.

And the By-law was read a first time.

And on motion of Mr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Bickle, the bill was read a second time, and the Council went into committee of the whole thereon.

Mr. Rowe in the Chair.

Committee rose and reported the By-law without amendments.

Report received and adopted.

And the bill was read a third time and passed, and signed by the Warden, the seal of the Corporation being ordered to be affixed thereto.

Mr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Rowe, moves, That this Council cannot separate without expressing their approval of the very efficient manner in which the Warden has discharged the duties of presiding officer over this Council.

Mr. Wixson, seconded by Mr. Gamble, moves, That the account of the Clerk for disbursements for 1862 and 1863, amounting to \$9 55, be allowed, and that the Warden issue his warrant

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to the Treasurer for payment of the same.

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# REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

JUNE SESSION, 1863.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON ROADS AND BRIDGES.

*To the Municipal Council of the County of Ontario :*

The Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, beg to report :

That they have had before them the petition of George Leask and others, praying for aid on the side line, between Lots Nos. 25 and 26, in the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th concessions of the Township of Scott. Your Committee, however, decline recommending the granting of the prayer of the petition.

That your Committee have examined the following accounts, and recommend that they be paid :

John McKay, salary as Bridge-keeper at the Narrows,	
sundries.....	\$20 50
John McKay, repairs on Bridge.....	8 10
John Shier, expenses inspecting and letting work.....	30 00
Thomas Paxton & Co., work and material on Seugog Bridge.....	157 07

That in view of the importance of having the advantages of a Canal route through this County, duly ascertained, your Com-

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mittee would recommend that a sum not exceeding \$600, be appropriated in ascertaining, by a survey, the advantages and practicability of a route through this County for the making of a Canal, connecting the Georgian Bay with Lake Ontario, and that the same be expended under the direction of your Committee.

That your Committee would also recommend that a deputation to be appointed by this Council, be authorized to proceed to Quebec at the next meeting of Parliament, to meet the delegates from Chicago, for the purpose of bringing before Parliament and the country, the advantages possessed by this County as a route for said Canal.

That your Committee would recommend that a sum of one hundred dollars, be granted by this Council, for completing the work now undertaken on the Centre road, in the Township of Thorah, under the direction of the County Engineer, and fifty dollars in the 14th concession of Brock, on the Centre road.

That your Committee would also recommend that a further sum of fifty dollars, be granted by this Council to complete the road in Rama, so as to extend the road to the Muskoka road, and that the same be expended under the direction of the County Engineer.

That your Committee having learned from the report of the County Engineer, that the Council of the United Counties of York and Peel declined contributing to the erection of the said bridge, in consequence of the raising of the water by Mr. Brethour's dam, would recommend that the By-law passed in the last January Session, appropriating \$1,200 towards the erection of the said bridge, be repealed, and that a Commissioner be appointed, to confer with the Commissioner appointed by the United Counties of York and Peel, with a view to the erection

of the said bridge, and that such Commissioner be empowered to authorize the construction of such bridge, so that the same shall not cost this County more than \$1,000.

That your Committee would recommend the following appropriations:—On Dayton's Hill, in East Whitby, \$200, and on the Brock road, in the 7th and 8th concessions of Whitby \$200. That your Committee would recommend that the bridge keeper, at the Norrows's bridge, be paid his salary in June and November, instead of July and January as formerly.

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REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON COUNTY PROPERTY.

*To the Municipal Council of the County of Ontario:*

The Standing Committee on County Property beg leave to report.

1st. That the several improvements in the Gaol yard, recommended in the report of January last, have been effected in a satisfactory manner.

2nd. That your Committee have inspected the Gaol, and find it in the usual condition, which is the highest recommendation it can receive.

3rd. The Gaoler has represented to your Committee, that it would be a matter of great convenience to have a sidewalk constructed on the North side of the Court House block, from Centre street to the Gaol yard gate, and as the proposed sidewalk would be almost wholly used in going to the Gaol premises, your Committee are of opinion that the County should provide the means for its construction, and would therefore recommend that the County Engineer cause the work to be done.

4th. Respecting the application of the Council of Thorah, for leave to cut a drain through the yard of the Lock-up house at Beaverton, your Committee recommend that their request be granted, provided it in nowise injures the property.

5th. The undermentioned accounts being properly certified by the County Engineer, your committee have examined carefully, and believe to be correct, and would recommend the payment thereof, viz :

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REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO REPORT UPON THE DESIRABILITY OF ESTABLISHING A COUNTY HOUSE OF INDUSTRY, AND INDUSTRIAL FARM.

*To the Municipal Council of the County of Ontario :*

The Special Committee appointed to report upon the desirability of establishing a County House of Industry, and Industrial Farm, beg to report :

That the large and encreasing amount paid by the different Municipalities in the County, is evidence that an institution of the kind referred to, will, ere long, be absolutely necessary, and even now, your Committee are of opinion, would be a means of providing the necessary comforts and sustenance [for the destitute poor, at a less expense than by the manner in which they are at present relieved.

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The necessity for some institution to which idle and profligate characters might be sent, is also much felt, and an Industrial Farm in connection with the House of Industry, would, in the opinion of your Committee, afford such a place.

It appears from the returns made in conformity with the Statute, that \$882 was expended in the year 1862, for the support of the poor in the County, and which amount will, in all probability, be annually increasing.

However desirable your Committee might deem it to commence an institution of the kind at once; yet, the want of necessary information in reference thereto, renders it undesirable to take any other steps at present, than to endeavor to obtain, and place in possession of this Council, facts in reference to institutions of the kind now in operation, and with this view, it is recommended that the members of this Committee do endeavor to ascertain the manner in which such institutions are conducted, and whether their establishment and maintenance is attended with much expense, or whether they might not be rendered self-sustaining, and furnish such information to this Council for its guidance at a future Session.

Leaving \$15,000 to be provided for by assessment the present year, for the estimated current expenses of the County for the year 1864.

Your Committee have carefully examined the report of the County Treasurer, wherein he estimated the deficiency, to the 1st October next, at \$5,684. The estimate of the Treasurer, could have been carried forward to the 1st January next, with about the same result. To provide for this temporary deficiency of three or four months, your Committee recommend that the Warden and County Treasurer make the customary arrangements for the necessary bank accommodation, until funds are realized from the assessment of the present year.

Your Committee recommend that the County Treasurer pay to the following named Municipalities, the amount at their credit, with the "Non-resident Land Fund account, viz:

Your Committee have carefully examined the petitions of several of the ratepayers of Scott, relative to the recommendation contained in the report of your Committee in January last extending the time for the Townships of Brock and Scott, to the first February in each year, to pay their County Assessments without interest. The petitioners are evidently under the impression, that the extension of the time by the County Council to the Corporations of Scott and Brock, from the first of January to the first of February, for the payment to the County Treasurer of the County rates without interest, also extends the time, to the same period, for the collection of the local taxes in the Townships; such is not the case. By-law No. 78, and the recommendations of your Committee at the January Session, are merely instructions to the County Treasurer as to what period interest shall commence to be charged against certain Municipalities, for unpaid County rates to the County Treasurer. The time for the collection of the County Township and school rates, by the local collector of each Corporation, was not changed or altered in any particular. That power properly belongs to each local Corporation, to be used as the circumstances of each may require.

Sec. 104, Cap. 55, Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, clearly gives the power to each local Corporation, to authorize, by resolution, the extension of time after the 14th December in each year, for the return of the Collector's Roll. With the local Corporation exists the whole control over the particular

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time at which the local collector's roll shall be returned to the local Corporation, whether that time be before or after the 14th December in each year. Refer to section 3, of Cap. 21, 18 Vic. a full explanation of Sec. 104, Cap. 55, Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

Your Committee recommend that the Auditors' report, including the detailed accounts of receipts and expenditures of 1862, be printed in the journals of the present Session.

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COUNTY ENGINEER'S REPORT.

*To the Municipal Council of the County of Ontario :*

I have the honor to report :

That a water closet and ash house have been erected in the Gaol yard, some necessary repairs made, and supplies obtained for the Court House and Gaol, the accounts for which, having been carefully examined and certified, are herewith submitted.



That during the five months ending on the 31st of May, the Gaoler's books shew that 40 prisoners, 33 of whom were males, and 7 females, have been confined in Gaol for periods varying from 2 to 151 days. That one female has been committed twice during said term. That on the 31st of May, there remained in Gaol 8 males and 2 female prisoners. That the aggregate number of days on which prisoners were on Gaol allowance, during the above term, is 1685, of this number 1434 were on male allowance, and 251 on female allowance, and that the aggregate cost for food, during the said term, is \$143 77. shewing an average of about 8½ cents, per day, for each prisoner.

That on the 19th of March last, I accompanied Wm. Tyrell, Esq., of Weston, a Commissioner appointed by the Council of the United Counties of York and Peel, to the site of the proposed bridge over the east branch of the Black River, on the Town-line between Scott and Georgina. Mr. Tyrell approved of the plan suggested by me, and signified his readiness to cooperate with me in the erection of a bridge over the natural channel of the river, but objected to the extra work required in consequence of Mr. Arnold Brethour's mill dam, on the ground that he considers that the Council has no authority to expend money for any such purpose. For this reason, and also, as the season was then too far advanced to procure materials for the bridge during sleighing, we agreed to postpone the matter until after the June Session of the Council.

That having carefully examined the Centre road, on the Town-line between Brock and Thorah, and through the 1st, 2nd and 3rd concessions of Thorah, I was of opinion that the amount appropriated by By-law No. 108, was sufficient to chop the same, where not already cleared, 33 feet wide, and to clear,

grub and level a space 16 feet wide, and on this estimate, proceeded to let the work, and from the numbers present, considerable competition was anticipated, but not realized. The lowest offers received were 1s 4d per rod, on the Town line, and 1s 8d on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd concessions, which would amount to from \$30 to \$40 over the amount appropriated. I have let the work at the above rates, subject to the approval of the Council. The south half of the 4th concession has been chopped the full width, 66 feet, by volunteer labor, during the past spring, it still requires the centre space to be cleared off, grubbed, and levelled. There is also part of the 1st concession, on which the timber has been cut for some time, the centre of which requires to be cleared, grubbed and levelled, to accomplish which, and make a good level winter road, free from stumps or other interruption, from the road between lots 12 and 13, in rear of Brock, to the Cameron road, in the 4th concession of Thorah, would require an additional grant of about \$100.

That agreeably to By-law No. 108, I have let a contract for cleaning, grubbing, and levelling a track, 12 feet wide, on the Lake Shore road in Rama, from Lot No. 24, in the front concession, to a point about 10 chains north of the new bridge over the east branch of the Severn, being about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles, for the amount appropriated, \$200. About \$50 more would be required to continue the same to the bridge over the main branch of the Severn, (the County line,) so as to connect with the Muskoka road.

That on the night of the 27th ult., a raft in passing through the Narrows' bridge, in tow of the steamer "Emily May," came in contact with the guard piling, injuring it so as to prevent the swing being closed. Being at Atherly on the following day, I directed the Bridge-keeper to make the necessary

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repairs, which has been done at an expense of \$8 70, the accounts for which are herewith submitted.

And that the account for attendance and repairs at Scugog bridge, amounting to \$167 30, having been carefully examined and certified, is herewith submitted.

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REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

*To the Municipal Council of the County of Ontario :*

The Standing Committee on Education, beg respectfully to report :

That they have had under their consideration, an account of J. W. Allison, Local Superintendent of Common Schools for Reach and Scugog, for services in connection with a Union School Section, and also an account from Dr. Oakley, Local Superintendent of the same Townships, for holding a Special Meeting in a School Section, these accounts, your Committee are of opinion, should be provided for by the Municipality in which

the services were performed, if they are regarded as not included in the duties of Local Superintendents paid for by the Statutory provision.

In regard to the proposition made at the last Session of this Council, by Mr. McCabe, then Master of the Senior County Grammar School, for the establishment of Scholarships in connection with the several Grammar Schools in the County. As your Committee believe that material alterations are likely to be made in the Grammar School Act, do not now think it advisable to take any action in the matter.

Your Committee have received a communication from the Educational Department, shewing the amount of the Government Grant to this County, and its sub division among the several Municipalities, and which is hereto annexed, and the whole sum, viz., \$4236, as well as the apportionment to each Municipality, is identical with the apportionment of last year. In the communication, it is stated, that four-ninths of the grant depends upon a vote of the Parliament, upon its re-assembling; but expressing the opinion that there is no doubt it will then be voted. Your Committee have not, therefore, hesitated to make it the basis of assessment for school purposes for the current year.

In preparing the Bylaw for raising the necessary sum for the Local Superintendents of Common Schools, your Committee have been guided by the amount provided for that purpose last year, where not otherwise advised.

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**BY-LAW No. 115.**

*By-law to appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars towards the erection of a Bridge across the east branch of the Black River, on the County line between the Counties of Ontario and York.*

Passed June 6th, 1863.

The Council of the Corporation of the County of Ontario, enacts as follows:

1st. That the sum of one thousand dollars be, and is hereby appropriated, for the purpose of aiding in the construction of a Bridge across the east branch of the Black River, where it crosses the County line, from Lot No. 35, in the seventh concession of Scott, and enters Lot No. 23, in the first concession of the Township of Georgina, in the County of York, provided the United Counties of York and Peel appropriate a sum of six hundred dollars for the said purpose.

2nd. That the Engineer of the County of Ontario, be a Commissioner on behalf of the County, to expend the said sum of, in concert with such person as may be for the United Counties of York and Peel, appointed to superintend the sum of six hundred dollars on their part.

3rd. That the Treasurer of the County be, and he is hereby required to pay to the order of the County Engineer, the said sum of one thousand dollars, in one, or in several sums, provided that if the order is not for the whole amount of work contracted to be done, that it shall be accompanied by a certificate from the Engineer, that 8-20ths more work has been done than the amount of the order given.

4th. Provided always, that the County Engineer shall not proceed to let the contract for building the bridge; until the

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Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of York and Peel, shall have passed a By-law appropriating a sum not less than six hundred dollars, towards building the said bridge.

That By-law No. 107, appropriating \$1200 towards the construction of the said bridge, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

3rd. That the Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to the order of the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, the said sum of six hundred dollars, or such lesser sum as shall be necessary to complete such survey.

5th. That there be expended on Dayton's Hill, on Simcoe Street, in the 9th concession of the Township of East Whitby, two hundred dollars.

6th. That the foregoing sums be expended under the direction of the County Engineer.

7th. That the Treasurer be authorized, and he is hereby required, to pay the several sums herein mentioned, on the certificate of the County Engineer.
