Keep in mind at all times that you must die; and live as if you may die soon. The things of this world are not worth your care, for they fade: care for the things of the next world, for they do not fade.

The earth is full of bad deeds: we ought to do what is good, and teach those who have done bad deeds, to do so no more; but to do those which are good.

Keep your book clean: that you may do so, keep your hands clean, and do not let your book fall out of your hand; for if you do so, it will get dirt on it, which will spoil it.

Say no ill words, and go not with those who say ill words; for God marks all these things in a book, and will try those who say, or do things that are ill, at the last day. God is just.

All things are known to God, and you need not think that you can hide your ill words and deeds from him, for he knows what you think, as well as what you say and do. Then fear the Lord.

Do what you are bid by those who have the care of you; for they know what is for your good; and they will not bid you do what will hurt you: the things that they bid you do are for your own good.

As you would have others do to you, so do ye to them. Do not ill to those who have done good to you, nor to those who have done you ill; but do good for ill, and shun those who do not so.

Hurt no one, for God has said, thou shalt not kill; and we must not kill, nor hurt them who are with us. God has said thou shalt not steal, and we must do what God bids us; and we must not do what he tells us not to do.

Ill ways cannot give any true joy to those who walk in them; they may for some time think that they have joy in ill ways, but it is a false joy and it will not last long. It will give pain in the end. O Lord our God, thy name is good in all the earth. In the Lord put I my help: I will not fear what man can do to me.
