
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## - PREFACE -

THE first edition of the Cyclists' Road Guide published two years ago, having been entirely exhausted, and the number of cycling tourists continuing to increase, it was decided to issue a second edition revised and extended. From Niagara-on-the-Lake take the westerly stone road direct to St. Catharines. A more direct route to St. Catharines from the Falls is via Stamford and Thorold, branching west at Stamford. Leave St. Catharines by crossing canal and climbing western hill, thence direct to Hamilton, the whole road being good gravel and macadam. Hamilton by York street and Lake Shore road to Oakville, where choice of routes is offered to Toronto, the northerly route via Trafalgar and Dundas street being the better, though the Lake Shore road via Port Credit is not bad unless after rain, and is certainly more picturesque.

Starting from Montreal post office, pass through Hochelaga, Maisonneuve, CoteVisitation and Longue Pointe to the end of the island (Bout des L'Isle) with very good macadamized roads, these being within

the limits of the regular city drives. Then ferry to Repentigny and clay roads to St. Sulpice, with fair clay roads intermingled with long grass; then passing through St. Felix, St. Joseph, St. Gabriel, which are only a few miles apart, meeting sandy roads towards Lanoraie, where walking is the only alternative, for acres of sand can be seen on all sides, but getting better towards Berthier.

Clay roads will be found to St. Cuthbert and heavy clay roads to Maskinonge, and lumpy with deep dust to Yamachiche, inclining to sand towards Point du Lac. Good walking to Three Rivers on eccount of the sand mixed with long grass; and where wheeling can be taken in it would be best to take the wagon-wheel track. Crossing the bridge from Three Rivers to Piles Branch, heavy sand will be encountered for about 4 miles, getting better towards Champlain, and continue about the same to Batiscan; here cross by the ferry, which consists of one of the latest inventions and rowed on the "windlass" plan. When across the tourist will do well to enquire of the natives which is the proper road to take.

After a couple of miles a novelty in the line of roads will be encountered in the form of sawdust, which is not as bad as sand, but is very heavy wheeling until past St. Anne de la Parade, where macadam roads will be found through Grondines, La Chevrotiere, Deschambault, and then the nicest piece of road of the whole trip is from the latter place to Portneuf, a distance of 6 miles. At this place a boarding house only can be had instead of a hotel as is usually the case, and the traveller is advised here to fill his pockets (so to speak) for future occasions with the necessaries of life, it being very hard to get anything

that is palatable for a good many miles afterwards. Leaving Portneuf, roads begin to get very hard with clay lumps, making very slow wheeling to St. Bazile, and getting rocky and very "hilly" towards Point Rouge. Up to this point the land has been very level, but steep hills where "walking is good" will be encountered from here to Quebec. Macadam roads continue from Pt. Rouge to Belair, a distance of 15 miles, the longest distance between any of the towns. The roads then incline to clay passing through Lorette and getting better towards Quebec. Of course these clay roads were passed over on dry days; when it rains — — This journey was performed by Mr. Louis Rubenstein, of the Montreal Bicycle Club, who was accompanied by Mr. J. H. Thomlinson, of the same club.

is first-class in every respect. Good boarding houses everywhere else. The road from St. Laurent to St. Francois is very good, but the remainder is not much to brag of. Near St. Laurent you have to face a steep hill. It is not absolutely necessary to go round by St. Pierre in starting. The trip may be made from Beaulieu straight to St. Laurent, but perennial mud covers this road for 3 miles or so. The other road is longer and rough, but it is a long way preferable to mud.

Once the Levis Heights are surmounted the roads are generally level until nearing the boundary. As far as St. Henri the road is good macadam. At St. Henri take road to right and cross Etchemin river, first paying 3c. toll. From here on the road is clay and sand, very good in dry weather, and drying pretty quickly after rain. Leaving St. Joseph the country gets gradually wilder and more unsettled, and the roads less beaten by traffic. Nearing the boundary, sand and hills are met with, though it is rarely necessary to walk. The hotels are good of their class.

Leave Quebec by bridge over St. Charles river on Dorchester street and continue straight ahead, following the road as it turns to the east. As far as Chateau Richer the roads are the very best macadam. Beyond this point are clay roads, not much used. At Ste. Anne is the world-renowned miracle working shrine. A good deal of sand and some pretty stiff hills are met with as you proceed. Beyond Murray Bay is terra-incognita, as no sane cyclist has ever attempted the trip.

Below St. Paul's Bay address everyone as Mr. Tremblay—three-fourths of the population are Tremblay—and should you strike one who is not, he will answer to the name, nevertheless.

The trip across the bay in the magnificent steamer Prince Rupert is delightful. The road from Digby to Lawrencetown is fair, but contains some long stretches of good gravel; from Lawrencetown to Kentville the road is too sandy for the bicycle, and the best route is along the north mountain road, or by train. From Kentville to Windsor the wheeling is good, through a most historical part of the province including Wolfville, where there is a large college, and Grand Pre, where the great massacre of the French took place. From Windsor to Bedford the road is fair; from Bedford the road follows the shore of the Bedford basin to Halifax, and is very picturesque.

At Selkirk, is a historic church and graveyard, as it is here all the old first settlers are buried. At St. Paul's, 2 miles further on, is an Indian Industrial School, carried on by the Episcopalian Church. At Lower Fort Garry is a stockaded fort yet used by the Hudson Bay Co. At Selkirk is a Lunatic Asylum and the Government Fish Hatcheries (the largest in the Dominion). A trip further north to the Indian Reserve might be interesting, especially if the tourist could arrive about the time "treaty money" was being paid.

scenery.

Leave Winnipeg by Portage avenue which goes straight through to Portage la Prairie and follows the old Assiniboine Trail. At Silver Heights, 5 miles from the city, is the Manitoba residence of Sir Donald A. Smith, and here are to be found a herd of buffalo-the last of that noble race to be found in Manitoba. Sir Donald also has some fine Highland cattle and Herefords. Headingly, St. Francois Xavier and Pigeon Lake can be seen by keeping right on the same trail. When going through Baie St. Paul, after going over the third bridge, take the trail to the left; this leads towards the river and the river will be followed in and out for 3 or 4 miles and lead out to Poplar Point; keep the same trail for High Bluff until you come to where the trail apparently divides, going three directions-take the middle trail. From High Bluff to Portage la Prairie is considered the finest piece of road on the trip. This trip is full of interest to the tourist, and he will have to keep his wits to go the shortest way, but he can hardly get lost as he is between the railroad and the Assineiboine River all way. The scenery is nicely varied with riding along the river curves through the bush and again out on the wide prairie.

This is a clay road all the way through and is well travelled. Except after a rain it is excellent wheel-

ing the whole distance. Starting from the Leland House, Winnipeg, turn south on Main street across the Assiniboine and down River avenue and Pembina street. Follow the electric car track as far as the Pembina school, turning there to the right, and by taking this trail it will-lead right out towards the river and to St. Norbert. From here on the road runs between the river and the railway track, and the scenery is very pretty. Around St. Agathe the road is more apt to be cut up. With the roads in anything like their normal condition, Morris can be reached by noon, and the tourist is sure of a good meal at the Commercial. The road from Morris to Letellier runs along the track, sometimes on one side and sometimes on the other. After leaving Letellier cross the track below the elevator and take the first good trail running to the left (towards the river), and this leads right to the bridge crossing the river to Emerson. From Emerson to Pembina, N.D., is only about three miles and is a good road.

Follow Saskatchewan avenue west as far as Mc-Culloch's, take the trail to the right and go direct west again over a good road. From Austin to Sidney the road is fair but sandy, and from Sidney to Carberry is again through sand hills.
