





OUR CAPITAL




The Capital of England

It boasts of far more people


Than many a Foreign State.

THE NAVY.




Here are some British Ironclads—

England big.







THE FIRE BRIGADE.




The Fire Brigade! the Fire Brigade!

With all the Boer horses, and all the Boer men,


He cannot dictate to the British again.

THE TUG OF WAR.




Pull together, ye three

THE VOLUNTEERS.




I am ready, aye ready,


Let foemen advance;
