The Banner of the King

Rally Day Service

Issued according to General Conference order by the General Sunday School Board for use in the Sunday schools of the Methodist Church, on September 24th, 1916, or on the Sunday nearest thereto that may be more convenient because of local conditions.

Order of Service

Explanatory:

It is not intended that this Order of Service shall be followed in all cases exactly as outlined in the following pages. Modification or change in the Programme may be deemed necessary. There is enough matter provided for all schools and the adaptation and use of the Programme must be left with the officers in charge. It is very desirable that some time be given to learning the choruses before the actual service is held. Any Programme that could be presented on sight, without previous preparation, would be altogether unworthy of the important occasion afforded for popularizing the Sunday school on Rally Day. If the service is held in place of the usual preaching service, the minister's sermon or address may be substituted for some of the other exercises and the music arranged accordingly. In every case the local school must decide what to use and what to leave out.

The Offering

Statement and Appeal:

The Rally Day Offering constitutes the only source of income of the General Sunday-school Fund. It is ordered by General Conference in all our churches on this occasion. The full offering should be given to the minister to be forwarded without delay. Or if not given to him it should be sent by his direction. The Discipline holds the minister responsible for both taking and forwarding the offering in every case. Please remember that the Rally Day Offering of 1915 was not equal to that of 1914, and that unless more money be provided the General Board, its work will be very seriously impaired. If you have not a copy of the leaflet issued recently on this important matter, ask your pastor or superintendent for one. Kindly give the Fund an unusual offering this year that its many activities and enterprises may not be hampered as now by lack of funds.

The New Canadian Hymnal

It will be interesting to note that the choruses used in this programme are registered from the NEW CANADIAN HYMNAL. The new book contains 462 hymns. Of these a large number are new, having been selected from recent publications in Great Britain, United States and elsewhere, and including the brightest and most inspiring songs for Sunday School, Week-Evening Meetings and Social use which have been written in the last few years. At the same time the best of the old hymns which through continued use have proved their value, have been preserved. In the work of revision the idea was kept uppermost of making the new Hymnal serve in a larger way the field covered by the present book and it is believed that the result will be heartily welcomed.


Five-Minute Address

The Sunday School BANNER stands for the Truth; the end and aim of Sunday School Instruction is to make known the Truth; the great need of the whole world is the Truth; and the very heart of the Truth which is revealed in the Bible—our wonderful Text-book—is God's Love in Jesus Christ. The Sunday School should be the greatest Educational agency in the world for teaching the young both to Love God themselves and to make known His Love to others. Thus it is also a powerful Evangelistic and Missionary Institution for declaring the Love of God to all people. *Is our school doing this?* may well be the searching question of Rally Day.



Roll Call of the School

Note.—This Exercise may be differently arranged in different schools. If the school is large and organized according to the Standard, with Elementary, Secondary, and Adult Divisions, the Secretary may call the Roll simply by these three Divisions, and the Divisional Superintendents make a brief statement as to the membership in each. In the great majority of our schools, however, this organization by Divisions has not been made, and the Roll will necessarily be called according to Classes. In this case each teacher should respond by at least giving the number of members on the class register and the number present. It may be a very interesting item, too, if the classes respond by repeating in concert the class motto. Organized classes may well do this. The Secretary should be able to give a brief statistical Summary of the school membership and close the Roll Call with an Appeal for Recruits. Rally Day is intended to be an Annual "Boom Day" for the Sunday school, and should result in a considerable addition to the school membership in every place. Do not forget this, but work and plan for it all through.





Four-Minute Address Our Country's Call to the Young


