

THE SCHOOL

Historical Outline by Principal Jeffries

The history of Jarvis Street Collegiate Institute dates from the very beginning of the Educational System of Ontario. In March, 1807, mainly through the exertions of the Rev. Dr. John Strachan, an act of the Legislature of Upper Canada was passed establishing a grammar school in each of the eight districts of the province. Just one month later, in April 1807, the Home District School was instituted in what was then the town of York. Of this school, Jarvis Street Collegiate Institute is in direct line of succession. From Robertson's "Landmarks of Toronto" the following description of the school is taken:

"Early in the century, probably not later than 1805, the Rev. Dr. Okill Stuart built a modest frame house as a residence for himself on the plot of ground owned by him at the south-east corner of his house, and attached to it, he constructed a small low stone building, not much bigger than a roothouse. The stone walls stood in their native rudeness, but they were afterwards covered with a coating of clap-boards. In this primitive school house the first public school of York was established, and on the rolls of its pupils one may read the names of boys who became rich and celebrated men and of girls who blossomed into the belles of the growing capital. The school was called the Home District school, and it was opened on the first of June, 1807, by the Rev. Dr. Okill Stuart, who taught here several years."

In 1813 this building was vacated, the school moving to a barn-like building on the north side of King Street, just east of Yonge Street. Dr. Strachan had succeeded Dr. Stuart as master of the school in 1812. It was with no little anxiety, by intercession, and influence, that Dr. Strachan preserved the infant school from the rayages of the war of 1812-14.

After the war, the attendance of pupils increased to such an extent that a new building became necessary. A site was secured in a large field of about six acres bounded by the streets now known as Church, Adelaide, Jarvis, and Richmond. This block of land had been granted by the Crown in 1797 for school purposes. It was called School square, the block immediately south of it being designated Church square. The field was filled with hugh pine stumps and small ponds of water, while through the middle, from north to south, there ran a shallow swale.

The new school building was erected in 1816 from timber cut down in the forest just north of Queen Street. It stood near the south-west corner of the lot, the rest of the field serving as a playground. The building was a good-sized frame structure, fifty-five feet long and forty feet wide, of two storeys, and facing west. It was termed "The Old Blue School" because the exterior was painted a bluish colour. The pupils in attendance numbered from forty to fifty, ranging in age from seventeen to five years. In 1823 the Rev. Dr. Strachan was succeeded as headmaster by the Rev. Samuel Armour, who was followed in turn in 1825 by the Rev. Dr. Thomas Phillips.

In 1829 the school was moved to the eastern side of the block, near the corner of Stanley (now Lombard) and Nelson (now Jarvis) Streets. At this time there was eleven district or grammar schools in the province, with an enrollment of about three hundred pupils. For some time it had been thought advisable to afford facilities to the youth of Upper Canada for obtaining a more thorough education than was to be had from any of these district schols. As a

result Upper Canada College was established by an order of the Provincial Government. The Rev. Dr. Harris was appointed Principal. While suitable buildings were being erected for the College in Russell Square on King Street, opposite Government House, its classes were held in the Home District Grammar School building. The latter school lost its identity for more than a year, Principal Phillips having been appointed Vice-Principal of the College. The name borne by the combined schools during this short period of amalgamation was Upper Canada College and the Royal Grammar School.

In 1834 the old Grammar School was re-established as a separate institution, and was placed under the charge of the Rev. Duncan Macaulay. He was succeeded in 1836 by Mr. Cosens. In 1838 Mr. Crombie became Headmaster, and in 1854 Dr. Howe.

In 1864 the school removed to the east side of Dalhousie Street, just north of Gould Street. Rev. Dr. Wickson had recently been appointed rector. He remained in charge of the school until 1872.

In 1869 a new site for the school was selected on Jarvis Street, where the present Collegiate Institute building now stands. While the new structure was being built, the school was transferred to a building in Queen's Park, where the University, then known as King's College, was first opened. It had a frontage of from sixty to seventy-five feet; and was built of beautiful white cut stone. It occupied a portion of the site on which the east wing of the Parliament Buildings now stands. It was not long used as the University, and for a few years served as a Lunatic Asylum.

From this building the school moved to its present home on Jarvis Street fifty-one years ago. It had changed its name from the Toronto Grammar School to the Toronto High School. The following year Mr. Archibald MacMurchy became its Rector, and continued to be head of the school for the long period of twenty-eight years. During this time the school prospered unprecedentedly. Its graduates numbered hundreds, many of whom rose to positions of prominence and distinction. Under Mr. MacMurchy's administration a great impetus was given to secondary education both in the city and in the province.

In 1900 Mr. MacMurchy was succeeded by Major F. F. Manley, who had previously been Mathematical Master. Major Manley was obliged by illness to relinquish his duties after the short period of six years. He was followed as Principal in 1906 by Dr. L. E. Embree, who had, as Headmaster of the Parkdale Collegiate Institute, acquired a province-wide reputation as a scholarly teacher and a discreet and virile administrator.

In 1907 the school celebrated its hundredth anniversary. A tablet was placed in the front exterior wall in commemoration of this distinction, and a fund was raised with which to endow academic and athletic scholarships and medals.

The present Principal, Mr. John Jeffries, was appointed in 1914.

On September the twenty-ninth, 1922, the corner-stone of a new Jarvis Street Collegiate Institute is to be laid. The site is a particularly fine one, at the south-east corner of Jarvis and Wellesley Streets. It seems most appropriate that a site should have been selected on a part of which, there formerly stood the home of the late Sheriff Jarvis. The name of the school is thus linked up with both the street on which it is to stand and the homestead which it will have displaced. The building to be erected promises to be one worthy of the unique history and splendid traditions of the school.




THE HOME DISTRICT SCHOOL First School, King St., 1807




"THE OLD BLUE SCHOOL"

In the Centre of College Square, north of the present St. James Cathedral



Corner of Nelson — (Jarvis) and (Stanley) Lombard streets.








