

EXTRACTS FROM A SKETCH OF AMERICA'S CREATEST MANUFACTORY AND THE LARGEST IN THE WORLD.

The floors of the Factory building have a superficial surface of 160,480 square feet. * * ' In the yard are constantly stored three million feet of lumber for two years' seasoning in the open air, after which it is placed for three months in the steam drying rooms, which contain in the aggregate 400,000 feet of lumber. * * * Beneath the yard there are fire proof vaults containing four steam boilers of an aggregate power of 320 horses, driving three engines, which put in motion 102 different labour-saving machines, of the most perfect construction. In the Buildings on Fifty-third Street, there are no less than five of the most improved Planing machines, the largest of which makes 1,200 revolutions in a minute, representing the labour of 27 men, and another making 3,200 revolutions per minute, representing the labour of 28 men. There are 102 different planing, sawing, jointing, drilling, mortising, turning, and other delicate pieces of machinery in this Fractory. Each portion of the construction of the Piano, from the crude material to the completed instrument, has its separate department—numbering eighteen—in different parts of the buildings, under skilled artisans—hence the greatest perfection is attained—over 600 of the most skilful workmen have constant employment every working day throughout the year, in the Mammoth Factory of Steinway & Sons. Once accepted, none are ever discarged, except for some rare instance of gross misconduct; nor is there any such thing known as "short supply," or limiting the supply—on the contrary, the firm would gladly increase it, hence the off repeated assertions of unscrupulous Piano makers, of employing Steinway's workmen, or having themselves been employed in their Factory, is an imposture.

Pianos are like Watches, (subject to great climatic changes and influences.) Steinway & Sons is the only Piano firm that has given this subject a close philosophic attention, hence, no matter to what distant clime one of their instruments is sent, no matter how great the vicissitudes from
