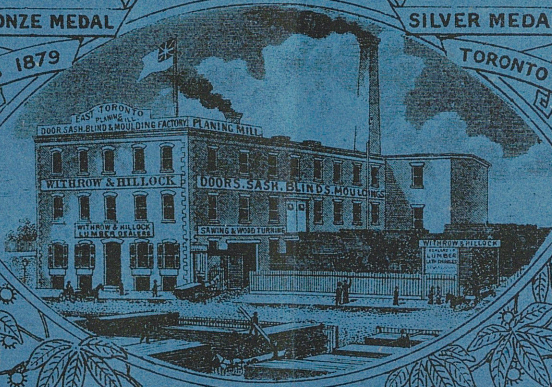

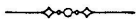

IN the manufacture of these Refrigerators, we are careful to use only well-seasoned materials, carefully put together by experienced men.

The surrounding walls and top and bottom are all three inches thick, having in their spaces two layers of prepared felt paper and an artificial lining, which our experience has proven to be very successful in the retention of the cold air of the chamber, and, as a consequence, the less rapid consumption of the Ice. The drainage pipe from the Ice chamber is fitted with a syphon trap. The door openings are fitted with three rebates, for the more completely retaining the cold air. The shelving is adjustable, to suit the size of dishes.

Our ordinary Refrigerators are all finished in oak graining, with good lock, white knob, and castors.

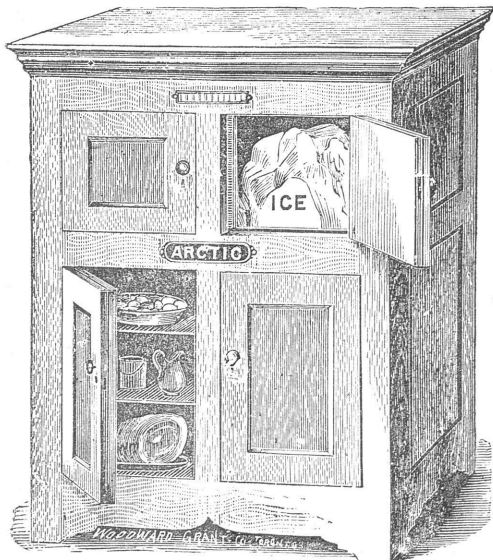

The above cut represents our No. 3 Family Refrigerator, most of which we make with the Ice door hinged on top and bottom doors in pairs, without the centre division. The cut shows box with centre division, so that one part of the Refrigerator can be left open for the use of the kitchen, and the other compartment in charge of the housekeeper if desired. All our boxes are made on the same principle and fully warranted.

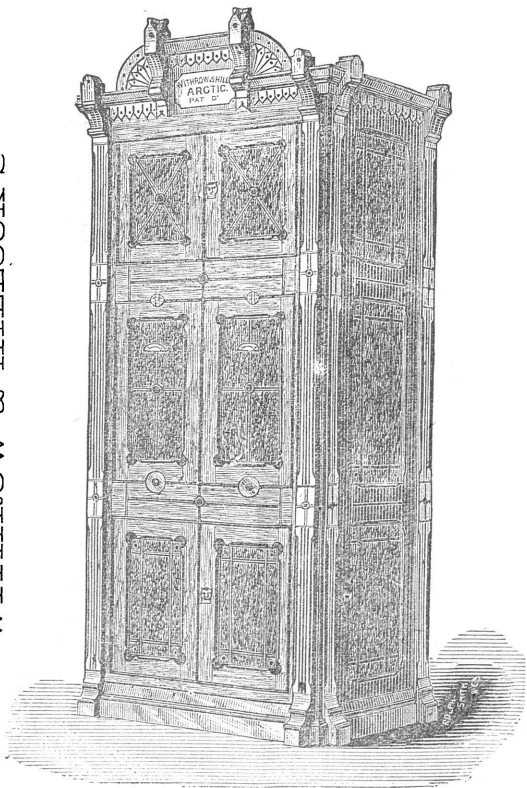

INSTRUCTIONS TO THOSE USING THE *ARCTIC REFRIGERATORS.*

OUR Family Refrigerators being lined with bass wood, will do away with the frequent scaldings which it has been necessary to give to the zinc-lined boxes heretofore sold in this market, and which then failed to make them fit to put any kind of food into them. The same attention to cleanliness that a good housekeeper gives to an ordinary cupboard or sideboard, where the same kind of food is usually kept, is all that is necessary for the **ARCTIC**.

Fill the Ice chamber when starting to use, and then regulate your supply according to size of box, so that a good supply of Ice is always in the box. This is the true economy, as you both save Ice and get the fullest satisfaction from the Refrigerator. Many persons wrap the Ice in a woollen cloth to preserve it. This is mistaken economy, as the Ice should be exposed to the Air in circulation in the box, in this way securing the lowest temperature.

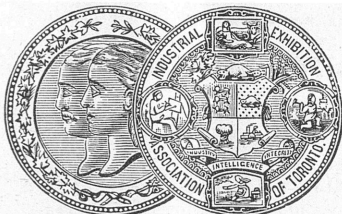
